## 2007-08 SCSU SWIMMING & DIVING NEWS Release Date: February 11, 2008



**NOTHIN' LEFT BUT THE BEST:** All the meets so far this season have led up to this point, the North Central Conference Championships. This is the final year of the NCC and the Huskies would like nothing more than to distinguish themselves as the conference's final champions. North Dakota won both the men's and women's championship a year ago, and each look strong again. In the latest dual meet power ranking's, the North Dakota women are ranked second and the men are fifth. SCSU also finds itself on the poll, with the women just behind UND at number three, and the men just ahead at number four. The South Dakota women are the top ranked team giving the NCC a sweep of the top three spots, with the Coyote men also appearing at No. 25. Further proving the strength of the conference, MSU Moorhead and Minnesota State also land on the women's poll at sixth and seventh respectively, with the Minnesota State men ranked 17th. So many great teams should make for a great meet when the championships kick off Feb. 21 at 10:00 am in Omaha, Neb.



**NEWS FROM MINNESOTA:** At the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center the story of the weekend was SCSU's Matt Verwey (Red Deer, Alberta) who blasted by the SCSU record on his way to a National Championship qualifying time in the 200 back. Prior to the record Verwey also hit a NCAA b-cut mark in the 200 IM. The men's team had their 200-yard freestyle relay team bring home a second place finish in the event, setting a new season best mark in the process. The relay team of Kyle Cordry, Doug McGrath, Mitch Dickison, and Jake Goergen finished with a time of 1:23.83, which was just a fraction of a second off the qualifying standard of 1:23.69.

**FINAL MEET OF THE SEASON:** Not every athlete will be moving on to the NCC Championships. The Minnesota Challenge this past weekend marked the final meet of the 2007-08 season for Elizabeth Barbee, Stepa-

hine Dauphin, Bethany Fuller, April Greene, Jordan Michaels, Alex Olp, Jim Schlup, and Nick Weaver.

**VERWEY'S WAY:** Sophomore Matt Verwey began the weekend with a ninth place finish in the 200 IM in day one of the Challenge. His time of 1:53.94 beat the b-cut mark, but just missed the automatic qualifier of 1:53.39. Swimming the 200 backstroke in day two, Verwey left no chance of missing the qualifier as he cruised to a 1:50.57 finish in the event, shattering his school record of 1:52.71, and easily beating the 1:51.59 standard. This marks a return trip to the National Championships for Verwey who swam in both the 200 IM and the 200 back last season.

**DIVERS IN SOUTH DAKOTA:** While the swimmers were in Minneapolis the Husky divers were in Vermillion, S.D. for the South Dakota Diving Invite over the weekend. In the first day of the event, SCSU's Kendra Willis took top honors in three-meter diving with a season best mark of 453.25 that was also a national qualifying score. Kelsey Berkeland finished fourth in the event with a 418.05 mark and Annie McNallen rounded out the Huskies in 8th place at 343.40. In day two Willis took the runner-up spot on the one-meter with a

368.60 and Berkeland was right behind her in third at 363.20. The two scores are now the two best of the season in the event and each was a qualifier as well. Coming in at ninth place was McNallen at 311.70. Competing for the men was Chris Pape who was third in day one on the one-meter at 379.95 and was runner-up in day two on the three-meter board with a 433.90.

SCSU HEAD COACH JEFF HEGLE TAKES ON HIS SEVENTH YEAR WITH THE HUSKIES:

Jeff Hegle returns to the deck for his seventh season as the head swimming and diving coach for the men's and women's programs at St. Cloud State University.

In his six seasons with SCSU, Hegle has led the Huskies to numerous NCAA Championship meets consistently finishing among

the best in the country. Last season, the women's team finished 19th at the 2007 NCAA Division II Championship meet, while the men fell just outside the top-20 at 21st. The best finish for the Husky women came in 2004 when they finished 11th at the NCAA Division II meet. Coach Hegle also guided them to 12th place finishes in 2005 and 2006 as well as a 13th place finish in 2003 and a 16th in 2002. The men had their best finish in 2006 when they finished 19th at the NCAA's, and also recorded 21st place finishes at the 2004 and 2005 NCAA's.

A season ago at the 2007 North Central Conference Championship meet the SCSU men finished in second place for the second straight season, while the women finished in fourth place after finishing third in 2006. The University of North Dakota swept the meet taking home top honors for both the men and the women.

Hegle is a familiar name to SCSU athletics, as he was a graduate assistant coach to the swimming and diving program for two seasons (1993-95) and is a former Husky swimmer. Hegle captained the SCSU men's swimming and diving team during the 1991-92 season. He received an undergraduate degree in social studies and secondary education in 1993 from SCSU. He then went on to earn a master's degree in special education at SCSU.

At St. Cloud State, Hegle was an Admissions Ambassador for three years and a University Award of Excellence in Leadership nominee.

From 1997 until his appointment at SCSU, Hegle had been the girls' swim coach at Monticello High School. He joined the Monticello program in 1995 as the assistant swim coach for boys' and girls'. He has also coached the Monticello Swim Club.

Along with his duties as head swimming and diving coach, Hegle also works as the Assistant Life Skills Coordinator.

Hegle, a native of Melrose, Minn., is married to former SCSU volleyball standout Christin Broich. Together they have three daughters, Caitlin, Tessa, and Molly.

NATE BRISLEY - DIVING COACH: Nate Brisley is a former Husky All-American diver that is returning for his fourth season as a diving coach for the SCSU swimming and diving program. A native of Excelsior, Minn., Brisley began his Husky career in 1999, earning two All-American finishes at the NCAA Division II Swimming and Diving Championships. After transferring to Drury University in 2000, Brisley continued his success with six more All-American finishes, a team national championship in 2003, and an individual national title on the three-meter board while being named the NCAA DII Diver of the Year in 2004. Entering into his fourth season at St. Cloud State University, Brisley has coached 24 All-Conference finishes, 15 All-American honorable mention finishes, and 10 All-American finishers. Brisley was named the North Central Conference Diving Coach of the Year in 2006 and in 2007, and he is also a two-time volunteer Star of the North Sport Director in Rochester, Minn. Brisley graduated from Drury University in 2004 with a degree in business.

JACKIE VIEAU - ASSISTANT COACH: Jackie Vieau, a native of Delano, Minn., is a first year graduate student studying in early childhood special education. A 2007 graduate of SCSU with a degree in communication disorders, Vieau swam under the helm of current head coach Jeff Hegle from 2002-2006. As a Husky, Vieau was a four-time NCAA All-American and the 2005 and 2006 North Central Conference Champion in the 100 free and 400 free relay. In 2004, she swam on the NCC Championship 200 and 400 free relay teams. Vieau earned her third All-American honor of her career with a seventh place 400 free relay national finish in 2005. There she also competed on three other relays at the national championships, as well as the individual 100 and 200 free. Vieau holds school records as a member of the 200, 400, and 800 free relay teams. She is also a member of the 400 free relay team that holds the current NCC record of 3:30.56. Vieau was named NCC Swimmer of the Week on Nov. 2, 2004 and Feb. 1, 2005.

NICK ROSIER - ASSISTANT COACH: Nick Rosier is a second year graduate student working towards a master's degree in exercise science and returns to the pool for his second year of coaching with the Huskies. Originally from Biwabik, Minn., Nick is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point with a bachelor's of arts in history. He swam at UW-Stevens Point and was a four-time conference finalist in the 100 and 200 breaststroke. His freshman year he was voted the team's Most Improved Swimmer and lettered all four years of his Pointers career. Nick currently resides in St. Cloud, and is getting married to his fiancé Jessica on December 29th of this year.

STEVE MOHS - ASSISTANT COACH: Steve Mohs is in his seventh year as an assistant swimming and diving coach for Saint Cloud State University. A former Alumnus of the program, Mohs began his career as a student-athlete competing for the Huskies from 1998-2001. He was named team captain his senior season. After finishing his undergraduate degree in December of 2001, he took over as the graduate assistant coach.
