SCSU DIVERS BRING HOME SIX TOP TEN FINISHES FROM 2007 NCAA DIVISION II CHAMPIONSHIPS: Sophomore Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley), sophomore Kelsey Berkeland (Coon Rapids), and junior Kendra Willis (Neenah, WI) showed the rest of the Division II swimming and diving world that the SCSU divers are among the

best in the nation this past weekend at the 2007 NCAA Division II Championship in Buffalo, NY.

All three divers brought home top ten finishes in both the one-meter and the three-meter board. Also diving for the Huskies was first-year Kayla Edelbrock (St. Cloud) who brought home a 12th place finish on the one-meter with 295.30 points and a 24th place with 149.00 points on the three-meter board in her NCAA Division II Championship debut.

Jimerson's strong diving advanced him easily to the finals of both the one-meter and three-meter boards. In the finals, Jimerson charted 397.70 points on the three-meter board for fourth place and for the second year in a row he was just short of the championship title on the one-meter board finishing second with a 452.15 point total.

Willis posted the best SCSU women's diving finishes on both the one-meter and the three-meter board. After clearing the preliminary round, Willis earned All-American honors following a fifth-place, 345.20 point total finish on the one-meter board. She then tallied 353.20 points on the three-meter board placing seventh.

Divemate Berkeland also cleared the preliminary rounds on both the one-meter and three-meter boards. In the finals she notched a ninth-place finish on the one-meter with 323.60 points and a finished 10th on the three-meter board with 333.75 points.

First-year Matt Verwey (Red Deer, Alberta) and junior Erin Lannon (Prior Lake) represented the SCSU swimmers, Verwey in the 200 IM and 200 back, and Lannon in the 50-free and 100-free. Neither athlete advanced to the final round.

2006/07 SCSU SWIMMING & DIVING SEASON WRAP-UP:

10/21

Sophomore Kelsey Berkeland (Coon Rapids) qualified for nationals on both the one-meter and three-meter board in the first meet of the 2006-07 season in Marquette, MI.

10/28

The Husky swimming and diving squads finished first in their first dual of the season against UW-Stevens Point in Stevens Point, WI. Combined, the men's and women's teams brought home 15 first-place finishes including both the men's and women's one-meter and three-meter boards. The women's squad finished the weekend with 130, while the men tallied 135.

10/31

Junior Ross Eiden (Rosemount) and sophomore Kelsey Berkeland (Coon Rapids) are named to the North Central Conference Divers of the Week.

11/04

The SCSU swimming and diving squads hosted their first home meet of the season suiting up against UW-Green Bay, South Dakota, and North Dakota. The women finished third with 766 points. This was the highest point total the women have tallied in head coach Jeff Hegle's six years with the team. The men's squad finished the competition with 914 points for second place.

11/11 In the second SCSU Husky Invite of the season, the men's and women's squads dominated the pool. Eight members of the women's squad grabbed individual titles and the swept all four relay races. The men's team tallied five first-place finishes and notched the top spot in three out of the four relay events. Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley) qualified for nationals on both the one-meter and three-meter boards with point totals of 273.10 and 311.95 respectively.

11/19 At the Minnesota Invite in Minneapolis, MN, first-year Matt Verwey (Red Deer, Alberta) demolished a four-year-old 400 IM record by first swimming 4:12.51 in the preliminaries and then one-upping himself by finishing at 4:08.403 in the finals. The previous record of 4:14.21 was set by the late Sean Gonia in 2002. Verwey qualified for B-cuts with his 400 IM time as did Brenda Peters (Faribault), Alisha Blaydes (Elk River), and Kelly Vieau (Delano) in the 50-free and Katie Brueggemann (Grafton, WI) in the 400 IM. As a team, the Huskies finished eighth with 233 points.

11/27 In the CollegeSwimming.com rankings, both the SCSU men's and women's squads were ranked fourth in the Division II Dual meet ranking. The men's team boasted 150 points with South Dakota in third with 153 points, North Dakota second with 159, and UC San Diego clinching the top spot with 163. On the women's side, SCSU totaled 151 points. UC San Diego was the third with 152, Grand Valley State in second with 155, and North Dakota holding the top spot with 170.

12/02 At the Husky Diving Invite, junior Kendra Willis (Neenah, WI) finished first on both the one-meter and three-meter board scoring 381.15 and 413.40 respectively. Her one-meter score automatically qualified her for the national meet. Sophomore Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley) took first on the three-meter board tallying 463.45 points.

While the divers were in St. Cloud, the men's and women's swim squads were in Kenosha, WI dominating the water. Both the men's (856) and women's (1,130) teams brought home first place team titles as well as a combined team first-place boasting 1,986 points. The women brought home 11 first-place finishes and the men, three.

12/05 First-year Matt Verwey (Red Deer, Alberta) was named the NCC Swimmer of the Week while sophomore Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley) was named the NCC Diver of the Week.

01/15 The Huskies returned from their week-long training trip in St. Croix. Those Huskies attending had the opportunity to swim alongside the sea turtles as they competed in the St. Croix Ocean Mile Swim.

01/19 In their first meet of 2007 and their first since December 2, 2006, the SCSU men's and women's diving squads took on St. John's University and the College of St. Ben's. The Huskies fared well in the new year as they swept the top spots in nearly all the events.

01/20 The swimming and diving squads headed to Vermillion, SD to take on the University of South Dakota. The women fell to the Coyotes 161-82, while the men won 132-105.

02/04 Sophomore Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley) sets a new school record in the one-meter board by boasting a point total of 302.25. The previous score of 302.00 was set by Jeremy Frye in 1998.

Three SCSU divers qualify for nationals while in Grand Forks, ND. First-year Kayla Edelbrock qualified on both boards as did sophomore Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley). Sophomore Kelsey Berkeland qualified

on the one-meter board.

In their last regular season meet, the Huskies battled against host and one of the top-ranked squads in Division II, North Dakota. The Huskies brought home two individual titles while the diving squads swept the top spots on both boards.

02/06 First-year Kayla Edelbrock (St. Cloud) earned NCC honors as she was named the NCC Diver of the Week. For the second time this season, sophomore Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley) was named the male NCC Diver of the Week.

02/13 Going into the North Central Conference Championship meet, the Huskies boasted a total of 48 athletes, 21 women and 27 men, who were ranked among the Top 20 in the NCC. 02/20 As they stepped into the week of the NCC Championships, 12 members of the SCSU swimming and diving team had qualified for the national meet. Divers Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley), Kayla Edelbrock (St. Cloud), Kelsey Berkeland (Coon Rapids) qualified on both the one-meter and three-meter board with Ross Eiden (Rosemount) and Kendra Willis (Neenah, WI) qualified on the one-meter.

Matt Verwey (Red Deer, Alberta) qualified for an A-cut in the 200 back with a time of 1:53.17. Six others from the SCSU women's team qualified for B-cuts giving them a national berth if they are a member of a qualifying relay team. Katie Bruegemann (Grafton, WI) qualified in the 200 IM (2:11.01) and the 400 IM (4:39.81), Brenda Peters (Faribault) in the 50-free (24.51) and 100-free (54.03), Alisha Blaydes (Elk River) in the 50-free (24.68), Sarah Burnell (Oshkosh, WI) in the 1650-free (17:59.14), Kelly Vieau (Delano) in the 50-free (24.81), and Alison Weske in the 100-fly (58.47).

02/21-24 Sophomore Sarah Burnell of Oshkosh, WI set a new school record in the 1000 free at the North Central Conference Championship meet in Grand

Forks, ND. Burnell swam a 10:36.90 beating the previous record of 10:39.02 set by Tennyson Anseth in 2005. First-year Matt Verwey also set a new school record. He swam the 200 back in 1:53.70 beating the previous record set by 154.06 set by Mike Wencel in 2000.

Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley) won both the one-meter and the three-meter boards posting scores of 503.05 and 500.15 respectively. At the meet, Jimerson was also named the 2007 NCC Diver of the year. Diving coach Nate Brisley was also honored as he was named the 2007 NCC Diving Coach of the Year.

02/27 Eighteen athletes from the SCSU swimming and diving teams were named to the 2006-07 Swimming and Diving NCC Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll. To qualify student-athletes must have a minimum 3.20 grade point average, have compiled at least two semesters at their current school, and have competed against outside competition. 03/14-17 Six athletes traveled to Buffalo, NY to represent the Huskies at the NCAA Division II Championships. Nate Jimerson (Apple Valley), Kayla Edelbrock (St. Cloud), and Kelsey Berkeland (Coon Rapids) all took on the one-meter and three-meter boards with teammate Kendra Willis (Neenah, WI) competing only on the one-meter board.

Jimerson tallied two All-American marks with a fourth place finish on the three-meter board (397.70 points) and a second place finish on the one-meter board (452.15 points). Berkeland finished ninth on the one-meter scoring 323.60 and 10th on the three-meter with a point total of 333.75, Willis placed fifth on the one-meter scoring 345.20 earning her All-American honors and seventh on the three-meter board scoring 353.20, and in her national championship debut Edelbrock scored a 295.30 on the one-meter board for 12th place and 24th on the three-meter tallying 149.00 points.

Red Deer, Alberta native Matt Verwey competed in the 200 back and 200 IM while teammate Erin Lannon of Prior Lake took on the 50-free and 100-free. Neither athlete advanced to the final round.

SCSU HEAD COACH JEFF HEGLE COMPLETES SIXTH YEAR WITH THE HUSKIES: Jeff Hegle completed his sixth season as the head swimming and diving coach for the men's and women's programs at St. Cloud State University in 2007.

In his six seasons with the Huskies he has led the women's team to six top 20 finishes at the NCAA Championships. This year the women finished in 19th. In both 2006 and 2005, the women placed 12th, 11th in 2004, 13th in 2003, and 16th in 2002. The men finished 19th in 2006 and 21st at the 2007,

2005 and 2004 NAAs.

This year at the North Central Conference Championships, the men finished in second for the second consecutive season with 654.50 points. The women completed the NCC's in fourth place after totaling 455.50 points.

At the North Central Conference Championships in 2006, the women place third for the third straight season and the men finally broke a four-year streak of third place finishes by placing second. This was the best finish by the SCSU men's swimming and diving team since 1989.

Hegle is a familiar name to SCSU athletics, as he was a graduate assistant coach to the swimming and diving program for two seasons (1993-95) and is a former Husky swimmer. Hegle captained

the SCSU men's swimming and diving team during the 1991-92 season. He received an undergraduate degree in social studies and secondary education in 1993. He earned a master's degree in special education at SCSU.

At St. Cloud State, Hegle was an Admissions Ambassador for three years and a University Award of Excellence in Leadership nominee.

From 1997 until his appointment at SCSU, Hegle had been the girls swim coach at Monticello High School. He joined the Monticello program in 1995 as the assistant swim coach for boys and girls. He has also coached the Monticello Swim Club.

Along with his duties as head swimming and diving coach, Hegle also works in the SCSU Compliance Office. A native of Melrose, Minn., Hegle is married to former SCSU volleyball standout Christin Broich. Together they have three daughters, Caitlin, Tessa, and Molly.

FIVE TO ASSIST COACH HEGLE FOR THE 2006/07 SEASON:

Coach Hegle will be assisted by four former members of the SCSU swimming and diving team, as well as a graduate assistant from the University of Wisconsin-Steven Point. Nate Brisley, Charlie King, Danielle Breunig, Jackie Vieau, and Nick Rosier will all lend a hand in working this year's team into one of personal and team bests.

Nate Brisley is a former Husky All-American diver turned diving coach with the SCSU program. Originally from Excelsior, Minn., Brisley began his Husky career in 1999. While competing for the Huskies, he twice earned All-American honors. He then transferred to Drury University where he continued his successful diving career. At Drury, he earned six All-American titles, including a National Championship on the three-meter board, and a team title. Last season Brisley was named NCC Diving Coach of the Year and in 2004, he was named NCAA Division II Diver of the Year. He graduated from Drury in 2004 with a degree in Business Administration.

Charlie King is in his second season as a graduate assistant coach in the Husky swimming and diving program. Another former standout, King swam for SCSU for three seasons and was a team captain as a senior. King spent the last two years as the head women's coach at Augsburg College. He was an assistant coach at Monticello for the boy's and girl's swimming teams, and was also a coach for the Monticello Club team. During the summer he is a coach for Richard Quick at the Stanford Swim Camps. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in Athletic Administration.

Danielle Breunig is a four-time SCSU All-American in the 400 free relay and a three-time SCSU All-American in the 200 and 800 free relays. She was a member of the 2005 NCC Championship 400 free relay team and the 2004 NCC Championship 200 and 400 free relay teams. Breunig currently holds school records in the 200 free, 200 free relay, 200 medley relay, 400 free relay and 800 free relay. She also holds the NCC record in the 400 free relay set in 2005. Named team captain in 2004-05 and voted the SCSU Women's Most Valuable Player of the 03-04 season. Breunig is currently working towards a sports management major and business minor.

Jackie Vieau is a three-time NCAA All-American and the 2005 North Central Conference Champion in the 100 freestyle and 400 freestyle relay. She was a member of the NCC Championships 200 free relay and 400 free relay teams in 2004. Vieau earned fourth All-American honor of career with sixth place 400 free relay national finish in 2006. Vieau holds school records as a member of the 200 free relay, 400 free relay, and 800 free relay and is also a member of the 400 free relay that holds the current NCC record of 3:30.56.

Nick Rosier is a graduate student from UWSP. He graduated in 2006 with a history degree. While working with the Huskies he will be pursuing a master's degree in exercise science.
