2008-09 SCSU SWIMMING & DIVING NEWS

Release Date: November 12, 2008

I THINK WE SHOULD SPLIT UP: This weekend the Huskies will be splitting up the squad with half going to Wisconsin for a dual with UW-Green Bay, and the other half staying close to home and heading to the St. John's and St. Ben's Invite in Collegeville. The meet in Green Bay gets started on Friday, Nov. 14 at 6:00 pm and will then resume again on Saturday, Nov. 15 at 2:30 pm. The SJU/CSB Invite is only on Nov. 15 and will begin with diving at 9:00 am, and at the swimming events set to start at 12:00 pm.

ABOUT THE PHOENIX: A member of NCAA Division I, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay women won the Horizon League Championship last season while the men finished in fifth place. So far in 2008-09, the Phoenix women are 4-0 in dual meets while the men are 2-2. Last weekend UWGB was in South Dakota for meets with South Dakota State on Nov. 7 and South Dakota on Nov. 8. Both the men's and women's teams swept the Jackrabbits and Coyotes over the weekend. In their most recent win over USD, both the men's and women's teams won 10 of a possible 13 events.

ABOUT THE BLAZERS AND JOHNNIES: While the College of St. Benedict has already began their season with a meet against Minnesota Morris and Concordia Moorhead, the Invite on Nov. 15 will be the first action of the year for St. John's University. Last season St. Ben's finished fourth in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference while St. John's tabbed a fifth place MIAC Finish. The Blazers are led by fifth year head coach Kathy Walker while the Johnnies are led by 11th year head coach Bill Saxton who has led SJU to eight top-three finishes at the MIAC Championships and three top-25 tallies at the NCAA Championships. Last season at the same invite the Huskies swept through the competition claiming the top spot on both the men's and women's side. Also, later in the season last year in a dual meet, the Husky men won 221-18 and the women won 205-38, making SCSU a perfect 4-0 against their Central Minnesota Rivals last season.

MAVERICK WRANGLERS: In the Huskies last meet, at home against Minnesota State, the Huskies swept the guest Mavericks with the women winning 165-97 and the men claiming a 163-137 victory. The sweep was the fifth straight for SCSU over MSU. The Mavericks have not bettered the Huskies since the Mav women claimed a win in the 2001-02 season. In this years edition of the win, SCSU owned the top spot in 19 of 34 total events.

NEW RECORD: Senior diver Nate Jimerson has further etched his name into the SCSU record books. In one-meter diving against Minnesota State Jimerson exploded for a 325.85 and set a new SCSU record in the event. Jimerson breaks his own school record of 316.80 that he set just last season.

WELL THAT DIDN'T TAKE LONG: Just two meets into the season and SCSU divers Jimerson and Ross Eiden have already qualified for the NCAA Championship meet on both boards. Jimerson went over 300 on each board, posting his record on the one, and a 310.25 on the three-meter. Eiden meanwhile notched his best scores of the season with a 292.40 on the one and a 297.05 on the three-meter. The national standards are 285.00 and 295.00 respectively.

BUHRNING UP: The Huskies Anthony Buhr had a breakout day against Minnesota State. The senior claimed his first four wins of his SCSU career, and now leads the Husky men in victories. Buhr won first in the 50-yard breast with a time of 27.32, before winning in the 50-yard free with a 21.52. He then made it a sweep in the breaststroke with a 59.72 for his third win, and then capped his day by swimming the first leg of the winning 200-yard free relay that finished in 1:26.84. Each of Buhr's times is also the best mark for SCSU this season.

FREE KYLE CORDRY: While Buhr claimed a win in the 50-yard freestyle, the Huskies Kyle Cordry earned wins in the 100 and 200-yard freestyle events. Cordry posted a 49.22 in winning the 100, and a 1:46.82 in his win in the 200. He was also a part of the winning 200-yard free relay team, and set all season bests on the day.

BLAYDES HITS DOUBLE-DIGITS: With a pair of wins against Minnesota State, junior Alisha Blaydes has already won 11 races on the young season. She claimed her 10th win of the year 54.61 in the 100-yard free, and then added number 11 as the opening leg of the winning 200-yard free relay team that touched the wall in 1:39.54. On the year Blaydes had eight wins in individual events and three wins on relays. A second place tally in the 200-yard free and third place mark in the 50-yard free from Nov. 1, are the only events Blaydes has entered this season and not won.

TEAM CAPTAINS: Serving as captains for the SCSU women this winter will be seniors Kelsey Berkeland, Sarah Burnell, Becky Johnson, and Jordan Wolfrum. Captaining the men's team will be seniors Mitchell Dickison, Brian Jacobs, and Nate Jimerson, and junior Jim Schlup.

2008-09 Swimming & Diving Roster

Head Coach - Jeff Hegle



Coach Hegle

Jeff Hegle begins his eighth season on the deck as the head swimming and diving coach for the men's and women's programs at St. Cloud State University in 2008-09.

In his seven seasons with SCSU he has led the Huskies to numerous NCAA Championship meets consistently finishing among the best in the country. This year, the Husky women earned a 20th place finish after earning 50 points at the 2008 NCAA Division II Championships. SCSU's men's team placed 15th at the Championships with 98 points.

Coach Hegle, along with former diving coach Nate Brisley, helped coach SCSU's junior diver Nate Jimerson to national titles in both the one-meter and three-meter boards in 2008. Jimerson tallied a 520.75 score on the one-meter and two nights later completed the Championship sweep with a 546.15 on the three-meter. Jimerson's three-meter score was only 10 points away from the national meet record of 556.40 set in 1994. To add to his list of accolades, Jimerson was also named the 2008 NCAA Division II Male Diver of the Year at the conclusion of the Championship Meet.

In the final North Central Conference Championship meet, the Husky men gave their best effort, but met up with a very strong North Dakota team that was able to hold off the Huskies and claim the NCC Title. The SCSU men finished in second place for the second year in a row behind UND. The SCSU women's also posted the same finish as last season when they took fourth in the team competition.

Coach Hegle also led three Husky individuals to NCC Championships in 2007-08, and for the second year in a row, Nate Jimerson was named the NCC Diver of the Year. Academically, the Huskies posted a league best 23 student-athletes on the NCC Commissioners Academic Honor Roll.

During the 2006-07 season the women's team finished 19th at the championship meet while the men fell just outside the top twenty at 21st. The best finish for the Husky women came in 2004 when they finished 11th at the NCAA meet. Coach Hegle also guided them to 12th place finishes in 2005 and 2006 as well as a 13th place finish in 2003 and a 16th in 2002. The men had their best finish in 2006 when they finished 19th, and also recorded 21st place finishes at both the 2004 and 2005 NCAA's.

Two seasons ago at the North Central Conference Championship meet the SCSU men finished in second place for the second straight season, while the women finished in fourth place after finishing third in 2006. The University of North Dakota swept the meet taking home top honors for both the men and the women.

Hegle is a familiar name to SCSU athletics, as he was a graduate assistant coach to the swimming and diving program for two seasons (1993-95) and is a former Husky swimmer. Hegle captained the SCSU men's swimming and diving team during the 1991-92 season. He received an undergraduate degree in social studies and secondary education in 1993. He earned a master's degree in special education at SCSU.

At St. Cloud State, Hegle was an Admissions Ambassador for three years and a University Award of Excellence in Leadership nominee.

From 1997 until his appointment at SCSU, Hegle had been the girls swim coach at Monticello High School. He joined the Monticello program in 1995 as the assistant swim coach for boys and girls. He has also coached the Monticello Swim Club.

Hegle, a native of Melrose, Minn., is married to former SCSU volleyball standout Christin Broich. Together they have three daughters, Caitlin, Tessa, and Molly.

TRACY TORGERSON - DIVING COACH: Tracy Torgerson comes to SCSU from the Sauk Rapids-Rice school district where she has been the head diving coach for the past six years and has taught special education for the past two years. At Sauk Rapids-Rice she was Section 3A boy's diving coach of the year four times in 2003, '04, '06, and '07 and had a five year run as Section 3A girls diving coach of the year from 2003-07.

Torgerson is also a Level II gymnastics coach for the Special Olympics of Minnesota, a post she has held since February of 2007. She has been a personal trainer, and was an assistant diving coach and swimming and diving instructor at the University of Minnesota.

Torgerson is a 2002 product of the University of Minnesota where she graduated with degrees in both Kinesiology and Spanish as well as a minor in coaching. She then went on to St. Cloud State University where she received her Graduate Licensure in Special Education in 2006.

At Minnesota, Torgerson was a four year member of the swimming and diving team from 1997 to 2001 and was a member of the Golden Gophers 1999 and 2000 Big Ten Championship squads. In 2000 she was the Big Ten silver medalist in three-meter diving and became an All-American in one-meter diving. The 2001 team captain still holds the University of Minnesota record for one-meter diving. In 1999 and 2000 Torgerson was also a member of the Minnesota track and field team.

"We are extremely excited to have someone of Tracy's caliber taking over the reigns of our program," said Coach Hegle, "Tracy will enable us to continue our success at the national level. Her philosophy and goals are what Husky swimming and diving is all about."

A St. Cloud native and Tech High School Graduate, Torgerson and her husband Jeremy reside in Sauk Rapids with their daughter Lilly.

JACKIE VIEAU - ASSISTANT COACH: Jackie Vieau, a native of Delano, Minn., will be a second year graduate student coach heading into the 2008-09 season and is studying in early childhood special education. A 2007 graduate of SCSU with a degree in communication disorders, Vieau swam under the helm of current head coach Jeff Hegle from 2002-2006. As a Husky, Vieau was a four-time NCAA All-American and the 2006 North Central Conference Champion in the 100 free. The year prior in 2005 Vieau was an NCC Champion in the 100 free and the 400 free relay. In 2004, she swam on the NCC Championship 200 and 400 free relay teams. Vieau earned her third All-American honor of her career with a seventh place 400 free relay national finish in 2005. There she also competed on three other relays at the national championships, as well as the individual 100 and 200 free. Vieau holds school records as a member of the 200, 400, and 800 free relay teams and is also a school record holder in the 400 medley relay. Vieau was named NCC Swimmer of the Week on Nov. 2, 2004 and Feb. 1, 2005.

MIKE WOOD - ASSISTANT COACH: Mike Wood joins the SCSU swimming and diving coaching staff for the first time in 2008-09 as a graduate assistant coach. A native of Chaska, Minn., Wood swam for current Huskies head coach Jeff Hegle from 2000-2004. As a student-athlete, Wood was all-conference member for three years and was voted Most Improved after the 2002-03 season. After graduating with a bachelor's of science in marketing from SCSU, Wood worked for Cintas (FAS) from 2005-08.

During that stint, Wood was the head club coach at Barracuda Aquatics Club for one season, and also served as a club coach for the West Express swim team for three years. Wood is working towards a master's degree in sport management at SCSU and currently resides in St. Cloud.
