2004-05 SCSU SWIMMING & DIVING NEWS

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS ON DECK: The St. Cloud State University men's and women's swimming and diving teams will compete at the NCAA Division II Swimming and Diving Championships, March 9-12, in Orlando, Florida at the YMCA Aquatic and Family Center.

SCSU COMPETITORS: Nine women's team members and one men's team member will compete for an NCAA Championship this week. Representing the men is first year diver Ross Eiden (Rosemount) will compete in the one and three meter diving events. The women will be represented by three divers. Juniors Sarah Nielsen (Mundelin, IL) and Sara Steffen (Farmington) and sophomore Kendra Willis (Neenah, WI) will compete on both the one and three meter boards. Junior Jackie Vieau (Delano) will swim in the 100 and 200 free, the 200 IM, and relay teams. Vieau is the North Central Conference Champion in the 100 free. Junior Alise Emil (Andover) will compete in the 100 fly, 100 free and relays. First year Melissa Eggleston (Ankeny, IA) will compete in the 200 breast and relays. Junior Danielle Breunig (Madison, WI) will go the distance in the 100, 200 and 500 free, as well as the relays. Sophomore Brenda Peters (Faribault) will compete in the 500 and 100 free, the 100 back and relays. Junior Kristin Otterson (Monticello) will compete in the relays.

LAST YEAR: The women placed 11th and the men 21st at the NCAA Championships. This will be the third straight NCAA Championship for Breunig, Emil, and Vieau.

COLLEGESWIMMING.COM: The collegeswimming.com website ranks the SCSU women's swimming and diving team sixth in NCAA Division II and the men's team 11th in NCAA Division II. North Dakota is the top ranked team for both men and women.

SCHOOL RECORDS: Junior captain Alise Emil set a school record in the 100 freestyle at the NCC Championships in 51.99. She also set a school record in the 100 butterfly earlier this season with a time of :58.37. Tennyson Anseth set a school record in the 1000 free at the NCC Championships with a time of 10:39.09.02. The 200 medley relay of Otterson, Eggleston, Emil and Breunig set a new school mark in the 200 medley during the conference championships with a time of 1:48.23. Vieau, Breunig, Peters, and Emil set a new SCSU mark in the 400 free relay (3:30.56) at conference. First year swimmer Caitlin Digney (Madison, WI) set a school record in the 200 butterfly with a time of 2:13.12

2005 NCC RESULTS: The SCSU men's and women's swimming and diving teams finished third at the North Central Conference Championships held February 16-19 at the University of Nebraska-Omaha. The SCSU women finished with 855.50 points behind NCC Champion University of Nebraska-Omaha (1,286) and second place University of North Dakota (1,266.50). It is UNO's first title and only the second time since 1981 that UND did not win the NCC title. On the men's side, SCSU scored 686 points behind first place North Dakota 1,590 and second place South Dakota 1,127.50. It is UND's 18th team title.

NCC INDIVIDUAL RESULTS: Final Day - Junior Jackie Vieau (Delano) won the 100 yard freestyle in a time of 51.99 which qualified her for nationals. Vieau, Danielle Breunig, Brenda Peters, and Alise Emil won the 400 free relay setting an NCC record and SCSU record with a time of 3:30.56. First year swimmer Caitlin Digney placed fourth in the 200 fly in a time of 2:12.84. On the men's side, sophomore Alan Einck palced fourth in the 200 butterfly in 1:56.49. First year diver Ross Eiden placed third on the three-meter board with a mark of 486.80 and qualified for nationals. The men's 400 free relay of Russ Daniels, Sean Fitzgerald, Ben Gill, and Scott Wolf placed third in a time of 3:10.44. **Day Two** - the SCSU men's 200 yard medley relay of Sean Fitzgerald, Ray Nelson, Json Calvert and Russ Daniles placed third with a time of 1:37.09. Junior Russ Daniels placed sixth in the 500 freestyle with a time of 4:45.58. First year diver Ross Eiden placed third on the one meter board with a mark of 426.95 and the 800 free relay of Isaiah Fuller, Doug McGrath, Jeff Dahl, and Scott Wolf placed fifth in a time of 7:18.27. On the women's side, the 200 medley relay of Kristin Otterson, Melissa Eggleston, Alise Emil and Danielle Breunig finished fourth in a time of 1:48.95. Junior Danielle Breunig placed third (5:13.06) and senior Tennyson Anseth placed fourth (5:13.51) in the 500 free. Breunig's time was a "B" for NCAA qualifying. In the 200 individual medley, junior Jackie Vieau palced sixth in a time of 2:11.66 and matched a "B" cut. Junior Sara Steffen placed sixth on the three-meter diving board with a score of 361.05 and the 800 free relay of Channign Anseth, Kelly Rothstein, Caitlin Digney and Erin Lannon placed fourth in a time of 8:09.61. **Day One** - St. Cloud State first year swimmer Isaiah Fuller placed seventh (10:04.76), junior Russ Daniels eighth (10:05.11), and sophomore Albert Logan 18th (11:08.18) in the 1000 free. Senior Tennyson Anseth placed third in the women's race (10:39.02). First year Caitlin Digney placed tenth (11:07.36), junior Kelly Rothstein 12th (11:10.22), first year Channing Anseth 16th (11:17.13) and first year Laura Seidenkranz 17th (11:17.30).

SCSU HEAD COACH: Jeff Hagle (St. Cloud State, 1993) is in his fourth season as the head men's and women's swimming and diving coach. In his three seasons with the Huskies he has led both the women's team to top 20 finishes at the NCAA Championships. In 2004, the SCSU women placed 11th at the NAAs, 13th in 2003, and 16th in 2002. The men finished 21st at the 2004 NAAs. Under his tutelage the men's team has placed third at the North Central Conference Championships in each of the last three seasons. In 2004, Hagle was voted the NCC Men's Swimming Coach of the Year. Hagle swam for the Huskies in the early 90s and was a team captain. This season he is assisted by Anthony Harris and Steve Mohs. SCSU's diving coach is Nate Brisley.
