HUSKIES OPEN SEASON AT NORTHERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY TOURNEY: The St. Cloud State University volleyball team (8-21, 2-10 NCC in 2005) opens its 2006 season in Marquette, Mich., at the Northern Michigan University Tournament on Friday and Saturday, Aug. 25-26. The Husky's season-opener is slated for 1 p.m. against the tournament's host team, Northern Michigan University, and then SCSU will wrap up its first day of competition with a 7 p.m. match against Michigan Tech University. On Saturday, SCSU will face Lake Superior State University at 9 a.m., and complete the tournament at 3 p.m. against Abilene Christian.

2005 RECORD: The SCSU Huskies finished the 2005 season with an 8-21 overall record and a seventh place finish in the North Central Conference with a 2-10 record. Graduating senior Angie Mayers was named to the 2005 All-NCC team and Jamie Schlagel, another graduating senior, was named to the 2005 All-NCC Honorable Mention team.

2006 NCC PRESEASON PICKS: The 2006 NCC Preseason Volleyball Coaches Poll was released on August 15 and picked the SCSU Huskies to finish in fifth place in a tie with North Dakota after both teams received 19 votes in the poll. Minnesota Duluth was picked to three-peat as the NCC Champions after gathering six of the seven first-place votes and totaling 48 points.

TEAM CAPTAINS: Senior outside hitter Lindsey Gothe (Elk River, South Dakota State transfer), senior setter Sierra Nowak (Marshfield, Wis.) and senior middle hitter Deanna Pieper (Williams) will share the team's captain responsibilities for the 2006 season.

SCSU HEAD COACH PATRICIA MICKOW: Patricia Mickow begins her fourth season at St. Cloud State University during the 2006 season. In just her second season at SCSU in 2004, Mickow guided the Huskies to the NCAA Division II tournament for the first time since 1995. The Huskies placed third in the always rugged North Central Conference that season and also gained a solid 19-11 overall record under Mickow's direction. In three years at SCSU, Mickow owns a 38-52 record and in her college coaching career of 17 seasons, Mickow owns a 281-312 record.

ASSISTING IN 2006: Jenifer Odette is in her 12th season as an assistant coach with the Huskies. Her responsibilities as the Huskies' top assistant include being the lead recruiter and running the strength and conditioning program. She works primarily with the middle and right side hitters. Odette played volleyball at North Dakota State University from 1984 to 1987 as a right side hitter. In her senior season NDSU posted a 44-8 record. She was an All-Conference, All-Region and All-American selection as a senior and in 1986 the Bison advanced to the NCAA Division II Final Four.



2006 Season Preview

The St. Cloud State University Huskies enter into the 2006 volleyball season with a positive outlook under the helm of third-year head coach Patricia Mickow.

After reaching the NCAA Division II North Central Regional in 2004 with a 19-12 overall record, the Huskies finished 8-21 overall in 2005 and are looking to regain the winning edge this season.

"This year our team needs to work towards staying focused for an entire match and compete for every point," said Mickow. "Most of all, we need to step on the court and expect to win."

Despite the loss of last year's seniors, All-NCC middle hitter Angie Mayers (860 career kills) and All-NCC honorable mention pick Jamie Schlagel (949 career kills), the Huskies have high hopes of competing in the always rugged North Central Conference. "Every year the NCC schools produce great competition and our team will need to be prepared for every match, day in and day out," commented Mickow.

Leading the way for the Huskies in 2006 will be senior outside hitter Lindsey Gothe (Elk River), who led SCSU last year with 316 digs (3.01 digs/game) and 376 serve receive attempts. Not only will Gothe be looked upon for her offensive capabilities, but more importantly she will be the primary passer in serve receive and looked upon for jump-starting the offense.

"The coaching staff will put Lindsey in a position to receive a lot of serves this season," commented Mickow. "She's also going to be looked upon to put the ball away on the outside, which will require her to adjust to any ball thrown her way."

The other two seniors who will lead the way are middle hitter Deanna Pieper (Williams) and setter Sierra Nowak (Marshfield, Wis.). Pieper, who played in all 29 matches in 2005, has really come into her own at SCSU. "Deanna worked extremely hard in making fundamental changes to her arm swing, which has allowed her to become a much more effective middle hitter for us," said Mickow. "We are looking forward to Deanna having a great senior season." An exceptional one-footed hitter, Pieper was third on the team in 2005 with 230 kills and fifth on the team with 2.19 kills per game.

Nowak, who brings the most setting experience to the squad in 2005, has tallied 32 matches played in her career at SCSU. "Sierra has plenty of experience behind her to help lead this team to a successful season," said Mickow. Finishing the 2005 season second on the team in set assists (198), Nowak will be looked to from her teammates to run the offensive attack on the floor. "Sierra has the ability and is very capable of running our offense successfully this season," said Mickow.

The junior class is comprised of Kristi Pangrac (Bowlus) and RaeAnne Stanley (Alexandria). Pangrac, who has evolved into a dominating right side hitter, has persevered through multiple injuries at SCSU. "Kristi has worked extremely hard to stay healthy and our coaching staff will look to her for a big block and offensive threat in 2006," said Mickow. Although Pangrac's sophomore season was cut short due to injury, she still managed to connect for 183 kills and was third on the team with 2.51 kills per game.

Returning from a red-shirt season in 2005 is SCSU's second junior, Stanley. "The coaching staff is happy with RaeAnne's work ethic in recovering from her ACL surgery and will look for her to become a primary passer and outside hitter this season," said Mickow. Stanley saw action in 33 games as a sophomore in 2004 and accounted for 11 kills, 92 digs and six serving aces.

Twelve combined sophomores and first-year players complete the roster in 2006 for the Huskies. Sophomores Andreana Pieper (Williams), Christa Swenson (Alexandria), and Danielle Stump (Jackson) will compete for the defensive specialist and libero positions. As a first-year, Pieper appeared in all 29 matches and was second on the team with 23 serving aces and 247 digs. "Andreana is a very athletic player who has worked hard at reading where the ball is going," said Mickow. A great defensive player who gets to a lot of balls that are not hit directly at her, Mickow added, "Our coaching staff expects Andreana to contribute with serve receive this year as well." Swenson, who transferred from Augustana College last spring, is athletic, quick and a hard worker. "Christa did a great job for us last spring and has the fundamental skills which make her a consistent passer," said Mickow.

The third sophomore who will compete for playing time in the DS/Libero position is Stump. A vocal leader on the court, Stump earned a starting posi-

tion towards the end of her freshman season after totaling 140 digs and six serving aces in 2005. "Danielle does a great job of talking on the floor and keeping the team fired up," said Mickow. "Defensively, she has the ability to spark the team and she puts up a very nice ball to get our offense rolling."

Kristin Speedling (Kellogg), Rebecca Zenefski (Champlin), Kelly Lynn Isaacson (Eden Prairie) and Emily Baldwin (Savage) round out the sophomore bunch. Speedling, who saw action in 50 games at the right side position her freshman season, collected 71 and 15 block assists last year. "Kristin works hard every day and we look for her to compete for playing time in the outside hitting position this season," said Mickow.

Zenefski, who saw minimal playing time at the setting position last season, is expected to see more playing time in the middle hitting position as a sophomore. "Rebecca did a nice job for us last spring in the middle position," said Mickow. "She is a smart, anticipating athlete who sees the court very well," added Mickow of Zenefski, who tallied nine kills and five block assists during her freshman debut.

Another young middle hitter is Isaacson, who returns as a middle hitter after appearing in two matches her freshman year. The final sophomore is Baldwin, who transferred from Southwest Minnesota State University last spring. "Emily is a good all-around utility player and great competitor and will compete for playing time this season," said Mickow.

SCSU welcomes a great group of newcomers to the squad in 2005, which includes Ann Deutsch (Minot), Rossi Hammer (Buffalo), Michaela Jones (Prior Lake), Alecia Lunde (East Bethel) and Shanna Seidel (Maple Grove).

"I am very excited about the potential of our incoming freshman and look for them to push our upperclassmen," Mickow said.

Deutsch joins the Husky roster after a successful high school career at Minot. "As a 6-2 outside hitter, Deutsch has an effective jump serve and good sense for the game," said Mickow. Hammer, who joined the Huskies last spring, is a very strong player and adds depth to the offensive attack in 2006. "Rossi has worked hard to get herself to a level where she will compete for playing time and she can put the ball away," Mickow commented.

Jones will vie for a middle hitting position this season. "Michaela is a versatile player on the court and has great blocking instincts," said Mickow. Lunde, who also experienced a successful high school career, will contribute on the outside this year. "Alecia is athletic and has the ability to play all the way around," Mickow stated. "She has the potential to be a primary passer for us," added Mickow.

Siedel completes the newcomer list in 2006. A defensive specialist in high school, Mickow commented, "Shanna is a competitive player who reads the ball well. She is an aggressive passer and will push our upperclassmen this season."

As SCSU prepares for a new season, the inevitable tough slate of games lies before them in both non-conference and NCC action. Early in the season, the Huskies will head to Marquette, Mich., to play in the Northern Michigan Tournament before traveling to Grand Forks, N.D., to participate in the UND Extreme Crossover Tournament.

"This year we have a realistic goal of finishing in the top three in the NCC if we can compete for an entire match," stated Mickow. "If we can finish among the top in the NCC this season, we should have a great chance of making it back to the NCAA playoffs."
