2008-09 SCSU WRESTLING TEAM NEWS

Release Date: February 23, 2009



ON TAP: #10 St. Cloud State (8-5, 5-2 NSIC) wrapped up its 2008-09 regular season last Thursday by falling to #3 Minnesota State 24-15. The Huskies will now set their sights on the North Region tournament on Sunday in Marshall. Last season, the cardinal and black qualified seven for the national tournament, highlighted by Brad Padgett's (Buckley, Wash.) championship at 184 lbs. and subsequent fourth place finish at the Division II Championships.

HUSKIES HANG WITH #3 MINNESOTA STATE: In a match-up of two top-ten programs, #3 Minnesota State pulled away from the #10 Huskies in the last match of the dual for a 24-15 victory. Down 18-15 going into the final match, Bobby Ross (St. Peter) needed to upset #2 Brady Wilson, but was pinned to end hope of a Husky upset.

Jake Roberts (Jordan) made the biggest noise for the Huskies, defeating second ranked Tommy Abbott at 149 lbs. Roberts rallied from a 6-1 deficit after one period to take a 7-6 victory. Josh Williams (Banks, Ore.), Tad Merritt (Canby), Derek Skala (Owatonna) and Brad Padgett (Buckley, Wash.) were the other Huskies to record victories on the evening. The matches were split an even 5-5 on the evening, but an SCSU forfeit at 125 lbs. and pins by MSU at 157 lbs. and 285 lbs. spoiled a chance for a Husky upset.

HUSKIES TREAD AT TENTH: SCSU settled in the 10th place slot in the latest Division II wres-

ting poll. The Huskies sit just one point behind ninth place Upper Iowa and one point ahead of 11th place Mercyhurst.



On the individual end, the Huskies boast three ranked individuals. Brad Padgett is second at 184 lbs., Tad Merritt is seventh at 165 lbs. and John Sundgren (Blaine) is also seventh at 157 lbs.

RANKED RIVALS: The dual portion of the season proved to be tough for SCSU, featuring eight matches against ranked opponents. The Huskies won two of those matches, with a 17-16 win over #13 Augustana and a 30-6 thrashing of #13 Findlay.

MERRITT-ING RECOGNITION: With his victory last Thursday, Tad Merritt became the first Husky to reach 30 wins on the season. John Sundgren is not far behind with 29, and will have to wait until the regional for another shot at 30.

HEAD COACH STEVE COSTANZO: Steve Costanzo is in his third season as the Husky head wrestling coach. He is the 13th coach in the history of the St. Cloud State University wrestling program, which dates back to 1949-50.



Costanzo begins his tenth season overall as a head coach. He has an overall record of 86-43-2 while coaching 82 National Qualifiers, 34 All-Americans, 2 National Champions and 22 Academic All-Americans.

A graduate of the University of Nebraska-Omaha, Costanzo was a three-time All-American wrestler for the Mavericks placing seventh in 1993, third in 1994 and third in 1995 at the NCAA Championships. In 1994 and 1995, Costanzo earned North Central Conference titles while serving as his team captain. He was named the Nebraska Collegiate Wrestler of the Year in 1994 and was inducted into the Nebraska Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2006. Costanzo still ranks as high as sixth on UNO's all-time win list with 133 victories as a collegiate wrestler.

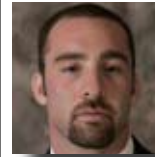

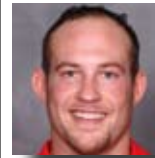

Assistant Coaches



Matt Lowers

Matt Lowers enters his second season as an assistant coach for the Huskies. Lowers came to St. Cloud State from the University of Minnesota, where he served as an assistant wrestling coach for two seasons. While at Minnesota, the Gophers wrestling team captured the 2006 Division I National Dual Team Championship, Big Ten Championship and finished second at the NCAA's. In 2007, the Minnesota Wrestling team repeated as National Dual and Big Ten Champions and also won the NCAA's for the third time in school history. While serving as an assistant with the University of Minnesota wrestling team, Lowers also worked as the Director of Wrestling Operations for J Robinson Intensive Camps.



Jeremy Lang

Jeremy Lang enters his third season as a volunteer assistant coach for his alma mater SCSU. Lang is a native of Springfield, MN and a 1993 graduate of Springfield High School. He was a five-year letter-winner in wrestling, three-time Minnesota High School state qualifier and a three-time All-State recipient in wrestling and placed fifth at state his senior year. He amassed a career high school record of 101-36-2. Competed for the Huskies from 1993-99, Lang was a three-year letterwinner for SCSU and a three-time All-Conference recipient in the tough North Central Conference.

Chris Heilman



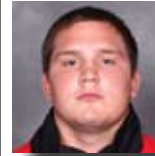
Chris Heilman enters his first season as a graduate assistant coach for the Huskies. A Colorado Springs native, Heilman was the 2004 Colorado High School State Champion for St. Mary's High School. He then went on to a successful career at Cornell College in Mount Vernon, Iowa, where he earned NCAA Division III All-American honors three-times. Heilman placed seventh in 2006, placed fourth in 2007 and placed third as a senior in 2008. He is the fifth wrestler in school history to earn All-American accolades in at least three years.

Tom Anderson



Tom Anderson enters his first season as a volunteer assistant coach for the Huskies. A Belview native, Anderson was a 2008 NCAA Division II national qualifier while competing for the Huskies. He is a three-time letter winner and a two-time National Wrestling Coaches Association Scholar All-American. Anderson earned the team's "Most Improved" wrestler award in his senior year as he accounted for more than twenty victories on the season. He completed his bachelor degree in business economics from SCSU in May 2008.

Nick Wilkes



Nick Wilkes enters his first season as a student assistant coach for the Huskies. An Onamia native, Wilkes was a two-time NCAA Division II national qualifier and a 2008 All-American for the Huskies. He was a two-year letter winner and captain of the team in his junior and senior seasons. Wilkes was named the 2007 Dean Weisman Wrestler of the Year for the Huskies. He was named North Central Conference Wrestler of the Week honors three-times during his career. He amassed a two-year mark of 45-16 and 21-3 in dual meet action. In addition, Wilkes was a two-time NJCAA All-American for Itasca Community College. In December, he will be completing his degree at SCSU in Criminal Justice.
