Report on Annual Goals: 2007-2008

Mission: *The College of Education (COE) strives to create an environment where all participants are critical, creative thinkers, problem-solvers, life-long learners, and global citizens who will advocate and work for justice and equality as they pursue their various professional roles.*

Goals:

1. Accreditation / Program Review

- a. The College of Education will be reaccredited by NCATE and the Minnesota Board of Teaching.
- b. All programs will be approved by the Minnesota Board of Teaching (with the exception of Health Education – suspended status).
- c. The Marriage and Family Therapy Program will be nationally accredited.
- d. The Community Counseling Program will be nationally accredited.
- e. The School Counseling Program will be nationally reaccredited.

2. Marketing

- a. The College of Education will develop and disseminate the *Viewbook*.
- b. The College of Education, in collaboration with Graduate Studies, will complete a brochure of graduate program offerings.
- c. The College of Education will invest in a display system for recruitment at conferences and fairs.
- d. The College of Education will develop a systematic marketing plan.
- e. A redesigned College of Education web page with companion print materials will be developed to increase visibility.

3. Recruitment and Retention

- a. The College of Education will develop a recruitment and retention plan based on trend data.
- b. All graduate programs will develop recruitment plans.
- c. All departments will develop recruitment plans.
- d. The College of Education will increase the number of students of color.
- e. The College of Education will expand the number of diverse field and clinical placements for students at the undergraduate and graduate levels.
- f. Within programs where enrollment is capped, faculty will increase the quality of the pool.
- g. The College of Education will increase enrollment in summer school by 2.0% this academic year.
- h. The Dean will continue formal meetings with the first and second year faculty members to support their professional activities in the College of Education.

4. Professional Development

- a. The College of Education will continue the Speaker Series.
- b. The College of Education will continue offering a monthly Symposium.
- c. The College of Education will continue the Writers' Group.

5. Global Education

- a. The College of Education will have an approved Global Education Strategic Plan.
- b. The College of Education will develop clear outcomes for the academic year related to global education as outlined in the strategic plan.
- c. The College of Education will increase the number of global experiences for faculty, staff and students.

6. Grants

- a. The College of Education will increase the number of grants submitted and funded.

7. Research

- a. The College of Education will develop an inventory of outreach research projects.
- b. The College of Education will increase the number of research projects initiated in the schools or community.

8. Climate

- a. The College of Education Climate Committee will successfully complete the goals established for the 07-08 academic year.

9. Diversity

- a. The College of Education will increase the number of students of color (duplicate of 3b).
- b. The College of Education will expand the number of diverse field and clinical placements for students at the undergraduate and graduate levels duplicate of 3c).
- c. Programs within the College of Education will work to ensure that candidates develop multicultural competencies and diversity proficiencies.

10. Outreach

- a. The College of Education will reexamine the alignment of programs with departments.
- b. The College of Education will strengthen the partnership with ISD #742 through the development of shared goals.

11. Data

- a. All graduate programs in the College of Education will develop data systems to track candidate performance.

- b. The database in the Office of Clinical Experiences will be 60% operational.

12. Learning Environment

- a. The College of Education will remodel the Curriculum and Technology Center (CTC) and develop an infrastructure to ensure updated materials.
- b. The College of Education will renovate four classrooms with new tables, chairs, and appropriate artwork.

13. Assessment

- a. The teacher education (initial and continuing) programs will strengthen their assessment of content knowledge.
- b. All graduate programs will develop and implement follow-up studies of students who have recently graduated.
