

The following is a suggested schedule for a MSAE student. Note that

- (i) All 600-level economics courses other than ECON 677 are offered only once every two years.
- (ii) ECON 586 and ECON 587 must be taken in the first semester as they are pre-requisites for all 600-level economics courses.
- (iii) ECON 677 is usually offered once a year, in Fall or in Spring.
- (iv) Only selected 500-level courses are counted as your electives. Please refer to the [graduate catalog](#) to find out which courses are included. If you want to take a course outside the list, please discuss with me for my approval.
- (v) ECON 570 and ECON 585 are not counted as electives for the program among the 36 credits.
