

Featured Fall 2023 Courses

Introduction to Gerontology GERO 208-54– Face to face and Online

What does aging mean to you? The processes of aging affect each of us in different ways, including biologically, psychologically, and socially. This class introduces the interdisciplinary study of human aging and provides a view of the world's rapidly aging population.

Aging and Diversity GERO 405/505

Explore the intersection of factors such as gender, race, ethnicity, culture, class, sexual orientation, geographic location, physical ability (and more) with aging. All of these "factors" are components of who we are, who we will be, and the experiences we will have as aging adults.

Dementia and Aging GERO 425/525– Hybrid (M 5:30-8:20 pm), Remaining- Online Asynchronous

What is the difference between Alzheimer's and dementia? What should you know about working with or caring for a person with dementia? Learn about the nature, causes and symptoms of dementia, as well as the impact it can have on individuals, families and caregivers.

Aging Policies and Programs GERO 411/511

Examine the range and variety of services and programs for the older population, especially those supported and/or funded under the policy, administrative, fiscal, or legislative control of federal, state, and local governments.

Research Methods and Design in Gerontology

GERO 650- Hybrid (T 5:30-8:20 pm),

Remaining-Online Asynchronous

This course focuses on the fundamentals of research methods and design (qualitative, quantitative and mixed) for gerontology. Students explore a variety of methods and discover which method/design works best for their research interests.

Ethics in Gerontology and Geriatrics

GERO 420/520- Online Asynchronous

Driving with dementia? Self-neglect? Right to refuse treatment? What do I do if...? Using case studies, current literature and real-life scenarios, we will explore a wide range of ethical dilemmas in aging practice and policy from individual, professional, and societal levels.

Meets Liberal Education Goal Area 9 & Diversity Requirements

Regulatory Management GERO 475- Hybrid (M 5:30-8:20 pm), Remaining- Online Asynchronous

This course covers the essentials of regulatory management for nursing homes and assisted living facilities including: state and federal regulations required to operate long-term care facilities, compliance, standards, human resources and business strategies. In addition students will learn about licensure requirements, as well as Medicare and Medicaid and other governmental and quality measures. Quality assurance and performance improvements and regulatory inspections processes as well as facility assessments including disaster and emergency planning will be covered.




