Featured Spring 2023 Courses

Introduction to Gerontology

GERO 208-54 — Online Asynchronous

What does aging mean to you? The processes of aging affect each of us in different ways, including biologically, psychologically and socially. This class introduces the interdisciplinary study of human aging and provides a view of the world's rapidly aging population.

*Meets Liberal Education Goal Area 5 & Diversity Requirements

Gender and Aging GERO 415/515-54

This course draws on a variety of sources including fiction, popular media, personal narratives and both qualitative and quantitative research. Areas addressed include gender inclusion and diversity, issues of health, work/retirement, sexuality, kinship, media representation and identity.

Housing, Transportation, and Aging GERO 435/535-54

Investigate issues of housing and transportation in later life in regard to the needs of older persons. Attention is placed on issues of aging in place, physical design, and innovative housing and transportation options, as well as working with older persons in a variety of housing settings.



Elder Law

GERO 430/530-54

This course offers an introduction and overview of the issues in Elder Law. Elder rights, public policy, criminal justice and the role of society will be examined.

Health and Aging

GERO 465/565-54

Study the physiological and cognitive processes of human aging, with a consideration of environmental, societal, and lifestyle factors which promote healthy aging. Topics include theories of aging; diet & nutrition; exercise; physical & cognitive processes of aging; health enhancement; & sexuality later in life.

Global Aging GERO 470/570-54

Aging is a global phenomenon (e.g. demographic trends, historical influences and the lived experience). The intersection of factors such as gender, ethnicity, geography, and class are explored.

Aging & Community GERO 630-54

This course explores the diverse experience of human aging in the U.S. and globally, with a primary focus on the interpersonal and instrumental concerns related to aging within different communities.
