**DR. STEPHEN FULLER** has taught at St. Cloud State University since 1975. For 19 years he conducted the SCSU Concert Choir. During his tenure as conductor the Concert Choir gave numerous performances with the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, had four international tours to Scandinavia, Bermuda, Mexico, and mainland Europe, and was selected by audition to perform at numerous ACDA and MMEA conventions. Under his direction the choir also traveled to New York, performing in Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall.

Besides teaching courses in choral conducting, music history and ethnomusic, Dr. Fuller has also served as Graduate Coordinator for the Music Department for the past 12 years. He has mentored 24 graduate students through the Master of Music-Conducting (choral) degree.

Besides teaching at SCSU, Dr. Fuller also taught at the University of Hawaii-Hilo and Luther College. He has been a featured clinician at numerous choral festivals and church music clinics throughout his years here. In addition, he has served as Minister of Music organist/choirmaster at several Lutheran churches both in St Cloud and in California. In 2004 he was the Academic Director of the SCSU British Studies program at the Alnwick Castle in Northumbria, England.
