About 330 college students will present their research April 24 during St. Cloud State University's 10th annual Student Research Colloquium.

The colloquium will run from 9 a.m.-7:15 p.m. in Atwood Memorial Center.

Students from St. Cloud State, St. John's University, the College of St. Benedict and the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire will present posters, panels and oral presentations throughout the day.

St. Cloud State alumna Moira Petit will deliver the keynote address from noon-1:30 p.m. in the Cascade Room in Atwood. Petit's speech "Got Exercise? Physical Activity and Bone Development," will discuss the value and timing of exercise in bone development.

The colloquium is open to the public.
