

Center for Holocaust Education plans four events for Spring Quarter

The Center for Holocaust Education has announced its events calendar for Spring Quarter.

Wednesday, March 25, 7 - 9:30 p.m. in Atwood Theatre

Speaker Pascal Bos will present "Women and the Holocaust." Bos represents the University of Minnesota Center for Holocaust and Genocide Studies. She has addressed international forums on Holocaust issues with a focus on the role of women in the Holocaust.

Thursday, April 7, 7 - 9:30 p.m. in the Atwood Theatre

Charles Fishman from the State University of New York will do a poetry reading from his recent book of Holocaust poems called *Death Mazurka*, and from other writings. His poems, essays, reviews and translations have appeared in almost 200 periodicals and anthologies. Steven Klepetar of SCSU's English Department will join Fishman in the reading.

Monday, April 20, 7 - 9 p.m. in Atwood Theatre

Henry Feingold, a professor of History at Baruch College of the City University of New York, presents "America and the Holocaust." He has written on the international role of the United States in the rescue programs of European Jews from 1938-1945 and the complications about U.S. domestic attitudes concerning ethnic politics. Feingold is SCSU's second annual Yom ha-Sho'ah speaker. Yom ha-Sho'ah is a Holocaust remembrance observed each year at the time that the Warsaw Ghetto uprising took place.

Monday, April 27, 7 - 9:30 p.m. in Atwood Theatre

Hinda Kibort, a survivor of the Kovno Ghetto in Lithuania and the Stutthof labor camp, will give a survivor testimony. Kibort was a prisoner from age 19-23, during which time her mother and 28 other relatives were murdered.
