

# SCSU launching 'Baby Cafe' for nursing mothers

ST. CLOUD, Minn. -- St. Cloud State University is opening a center next year for mothers who want privacy while breast-feeding their babies.

The "Baby Cafe" will be inside the St. Cloud State Women's Center's new facility. The room will be available to students and university employees.

In the past, the university has coordinated room arrangements on a case-by-case basis for nursing women who asked for them.

Jane Olsen, Women's Center director, said she has received dozens of e-mails and comments from people praising the Baby Cafe, which is scheduled to open in February.

It will cost about \$2,600 to set up the room, the majority of which is being paid for by the CentraCare Health Foundation, the fund-raising arm of CentraCare Health System.
