## WHAT SHOULD I BRING?

### THE NECESSITIES

- Clothes- don't forget your robe or swim suit
- Clothes hangers, towels and washcloths
- Bed linens: pillow, sheets and comforter  
(All halls will require extra long twin sized sheets (36" x 80") except for Lawrence hall, will require standard twin size sheets. CPA apartments will require full size bedding.)
- Laundry bag, basket or hamper
- Laundry detergent and fabric softener








### FOR YOUR ROOM

- Alarm clock
- Full length mirror
- Fan
- Decorations: posters, pictures, plants
- Pictures of family & friends
- Air freshener
- Carpet or large area rugs (Benton has carpet)
- Small garbage liners

### OTHER IMPORTANT ITEMS

- A copy of your health insurance card
- A copy of your social security card
- Medicines: aspirin, cold medicine, cough drops, and a supply of prescriptions
- Address book with the phone numbers of your doctor, dentist, bank, credit card and insurance company, and family or friends
- A few cups, plates, bowls, and a few pieces of silverware

### ITEMS TO LEAVE AT HOME

-  Pets - only **fish** in aquariums are allowed
-  Refrigerators **larger than** 4.3 cubic feet
-  Alcoholic beverages & empty alcohol beverage containers - SCSU is a dry campus.
-  Answering Machine: Voice Mail included
-  Open flame cooking devices or hot plates
-  Oversized speakers
-  Candles & Incense

### SCHOOL SUPPLIES

- Desk supplies: stapler, pencil sharpener, paper, paper clips, tape, folders, notebooks, ruler, three-ring binder, scissors
- Computer paper
- Computer disks/blank CDs (to use at the labs)
- Pens, pencils, white-out and highlighters
- Book bag or backpack
- Dictionary and thesaurus
- Envelopes, stamps and stationery

### LITTLE EXTRAS

- Bucket or basket to carry items to the shower
- Shower Shoes
- All purpose cleaning supplies
- Stereo and CD's
- Television and DVD/VCR
- Camera, film and photo album
- Computer
- Cable cord hook-up (20-25 feet)
- UL (approved) power strips/surge protector
- Phone book from your hometown
- Dry erase message/cork board
- Caller I.D. Device
- Bike/roller blades
- Plastic rain protectors in the event of rain

### WHAT'S PROVIDED

- ✓ 2 extra long beds per room (except for Lawrence hall, which has 2 standard twin size beds per room). Remember to choose the correct size (standard or extra long) twin sheets when purchasing your bed linens. CPA apartments will require full size bedding.
- ✓ 2 Desks
- ✓ Garbage can(s)
- ✓ Closet and drawer space
- ✓ Built-in or moveable desk lamp
- ✓ Voice Mail
- ✓ Cable T.V. and internet



## STORAGE

Due to limited space, the university does not provide storage. Please pack and plan accordingly.

## UNIVERSITY FURNITURE

Residential life furniture is university property (including chairs, beds, mattress and frame, window coverings, closet doors, etc.). These items may not be removed from the halls or from the main/floor lounges, nor moved from room to room without consent of the Residence Hall Director.

## LOFTS

All lofts require inspection and a staff-signed contract. For your safety, all lofts must be accompanied by a side rail. Lofts rented through [Bedloft.com](http://Bedloft.com) utilize the bed frame that comes standard in each student room and includes a side rail. Look for rental information in the mail mid-summer.

## REFRIGERATORS

A maximum of a 4.3 cubic foot refrigerator is permitted in student rooms. A rental program of 3.6 cubic foot refrigerators and microwave/refrigerator/freezer combination units is provided. Look for rental information in the mail mid-summer.

## R.C.R.

Each resident must complete and sign a Room Condition Report (R.C.R.) when they move into their room/apartment. Residents are required to inspect their room thoroughly and note all damages, markings, broken items, etc. The room condition report will be used to evaluate the condition of the room when check-out occurs. Damages or missing items will be noted on the check-out form and charged accordingly.

## POLICIES

It is your responsibility to familiarize yourself with Residential Life policies as well as the University policies and procedures found in the Code of Conduct, the University's disciplinary process, and the ResNet computer use handbook.
