APPLYING AS A FRESHMAN

- 1 Carefully complete this application form.
- 2 Include a check or money order payable to SCSU in the amount of \$20. This is the application fee and it is non-refundable.
- 3 Take the completed form and application fee to your high school. They will attach an official copy of your high school transcript and forward it to SCSU.
If you are no longer in close contact with your high school, you may submit your application directly to SCSU. Request that your high school send an official copy of your high school transcript to the University.

ADMISSION AS A FRESHMAN

St. Cloud State University strives to provide an academic and campus environment that prepares our students to succeed and thrive in a global, multicultural world. As part of our overall mission, we are committed to enrolling an academically qualified, diverse student body. For that reason, each application is individually reviewed and evaluated on its own merits.

Students will be considered for admission using a combination of high school rank, GPA, curriculum, test scores and other indicators of academic performance and potential.

- * The academic record is most important. The committee will give the greatest weight to performance in college preparation classes.
- * The strength of a student's curriculum is also a major consideration
- * ACT or SAT scores will be considered, but are not as important as the academic record.
- * Other criteria that may be considered are extra-curricular and community activities, school profile, and grade trends.
- * Personal statements and recommendations are optional, but will be considered when submitted.

Most successful applicants will:

- * Be ranked in the upper one-half (top 50%) of their high school graduating class
- * Have completed the MnSCU State University college preparation curriculum

And also may...

- * Provide evidence of ability to accept responsibility
- * Provide evidence of ability to benefit from the educational experience offered at SCSU

Students who are home schooled, graduating from high schools that do not rank students or have earned a GED will also have their records reviewed by the Admissions Committee.

SCSU requires all traditional-aged first year students to submit an ACT college assessment and a final high school transcript. The ACT assessment must be sent directly from ACT prior to entering, except for those who have been out of school three or more years. Please arrange to have ACT send this information to SCSU once you have taken the exam.

FRESHMAN STUDENTS MUST ALSO MEET MINNESOTA STATE UNIVERSITY PREPARATION STANDARDS.

Students graduating from high school in 1994 and beyond are subject to the Preparation Requirements.

EARLY ADMISSION INCENTIVE = BENEFITS FOR YOU

Students applying by December 15 and meeting SCSU's admission requirements will be guaranteed a space in the fall class. Other benefits of applying by the early admission deadline include being able to secure one of the first freshman Advising Day¹ dates and having a financial aid estimator completed early. Please note: taking advantage of the early admission deadline does not solely commit you to St. Cloud State University- you are free to apply to other universities as well.

¹Advising Day is very important. It's the day you will come to campus, learn more about student life and select and register for your classes. It's a day for students as well as families.

APPLYING AS A TRANSFER STUDENT

- 1 Carefully complete this application form.
- 2 Include a check or money order payable to SCSU in the amount of \$20. This is the application fee and it is non-refundable.
- 3 An official transcript from each college attended must be sent to SCSU. A transcript is considered official when sent directly by the institutions you have attended to the Office of Records and Registration at SCSU. Documents mailed, faxed or brought by the student are not considered official.

ADMISSION AS A TRANSFER

Undergraduates transferring to SCSU are admitted to the University if they have maintained a cumulative 2.0 (4-point scale) GPA or above in all college work and have at least 12 transferable credits. Post Secondary Enrollment Option (PSEO) credits cannot be counted in the 12 credits. Admission to a major program is a separate process; requirements vary. Higher grade point averages and/or specific course requirements may apply. Students should contact the individual colleges and/or departments for more information. PSEO students should apply as freshmen regardless of number of college credits.

Application / Information Form

Welcome and thank you for your interest in St. Cloud State University. It is important for you to be aware of the following data privacy issues before completing your application.

The University is asking you to provide information that includes private and/or confidential information under state and federal law. The University is asking for this information in order to process your application.

You are not legally required to provide the information the University is requesting; however, the University may not be able to effectively process your application if you do not provide sufficient information. With some exceptions, unless you consent to further release of private information, access to this information will be limited to school officials, including faculty, who have legitimate educational interests in the information. Under certain circumstances, federal and state laws authorize release of private information without your consent:

- To other schools in which you seek or intend to enroll, or are enrolled, if you are first notified of the release;*
- To federal, state or local officials for purposes of program compliance, audit or evaluation;*
- As appropriate in connection with your application for, or receipt of, financial aid;*
- To your parents, if your parents claim you as a dependent student for tax purposes;*
- If the information is sought with a subpoena, court order, or otherwise permitted by other state or federal law, and*
- To an institution engaged in educational research or accrediting agency.*

SCSU abides by the provisions of the Title 9 federal and state legislation forbidding discrimination on the basis of sex, race, color, gender, religion, marital status, creed, status with regard to public assistance, membership/activity in a local commission, status as a Vietnam-era veteran, age, ancestry, disability, national origin, sexual orientation, or citizenship. This document can be made available in formats such as large print or cassette tape, upon request.

ACT REQUIREMENTS

To provide academic advising and for institutional research, all new freshman students who graduated from high school less than three years ago must submit an ACT College Assessment Report before registering for classes. Students who already have completed an ACT assessment before they were admitted should have their student profile report sent to the Office of Records and Registration. Others may arrange to take the ACT assessment at a regional testing center on one of the regularly scheduled testing dates publicized by ACT.

APPLICATION REVIEW

The University begins acting on admission applications soon after September 15. Students are notified of admission within approximately two weeks of receipt of all required materials. All applications and application materials will be held and can be considered active for one year following the start of the first intended enrollment term.

APPEALS

Students wishing to appeal an admission decision may contact the Office of Admissions. Reconsideration will be granted to those providing additional and supportive information regarding improved academic standing, extenuating circumstances or other relevant information in writing.

RESIDENCY

To establish Minnesota residency for SCSU purposes and thus be eligible for resident tuition rates, you must be able to show that you have resided in Minnesota continuously for at least one calendar year prior to the first day of the semester. For more information, contact the University's residency adviser at 320-308-2111.

RECIPROCITY

Residents of Wisconsin, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Manitoba who attend SCSU may apply for reciprocity privileges and pay a tuition rate equal or comparable to the Minnesota resident rate. Application for reciprocity is separate from the regular admission application.

If you are a resident of Kansas, Michigan, Missouri, or Nebraska, you may be eligible to pay reduced tuition through the Midwest Student Exchange Program (MSEP). Students who qualify pay 150% of Minnesota resident tuition - for significant savings off regular nonresident rates.
