Welcome to St. Cloud State! We are committed to providing a safe and respectful campus environment for everyone. However, each year at schools across the country, students experience crises such as sexual assault, relationship violence, stalking, and discrimination. St. Cloud State is committed to addressing these problems starting with educational training right from the start.


In fact, state and federal laws require colleges and universities to provide sexual violence prevention training to incoming students in order to reduce the harms caused by all forms of gender-based violence.

- Sexual violence is a pervasive issue. The 2020 College Student Health Survey Report found close to 40% of female-identified and 16% of male-identified students disclosed being sexually assaulted thus far in their lifetime.
- Minnesota State has an <u>affirmative consent policy</u>, which states "Consent is informed, freely given, and mutually understood willingness to participate in sexual activity that is expressed by clear, unambiguous, and affirmative words or actions." (1B.3, pg. 2). This means that it is the responsibility of the person who initiates sexual activity to ensure their partner desires and agrees to it throughout. "Giving in" is not giving consent.
- Fully watch all of the videos. This will prepare you to answer questions with ease and accuracy. You must complete all six units and review all three resource pages to complete the program.
