Electronic Classroom Updates: VCR Removal

Faculty were notified during spring semester of 2017 that VCR units were being phased out of electronic classrooms over a two-year period. At this time, these units have been removed from Riverview and the Education Building. In collaboration with faculty and administration, it was determined to move forward with removing most VCR and DVD/VHS combination units in the following buildings this summer: Engineering and Computing Center, Robert Wick Science Building and annex, Brown Hall and Headley Hall.
