IT Partnership Highlight: Student Placement Software



ITS partnered with the College of Education and Learning Design to implement InPlace, a new student placement system. InPlace replaces a homegrown SharePoint site and offers an efficient and user-friendly service to support students working towards student teaching placement and clinic experiences. It is a complete student placement solution with tools to facilitate students requests for placement, coordination of assessment and placement, and management of students in work placements.

IT Security Tip: Do Not Use USB Drives from Unknown Sources



According to the FBI, there have been reports of individuals receiving unexpected (and malware-infected) USB drives in the mail that appeared to come from known organizations (e.g. Amazon, the US Department of Health and Human Services). Avoid plugging unknown USB drives into computers, including unexpected USB drives that arrive through the mail. Use the CISA's USB Cybersecurity Tip Sheet for more information.
