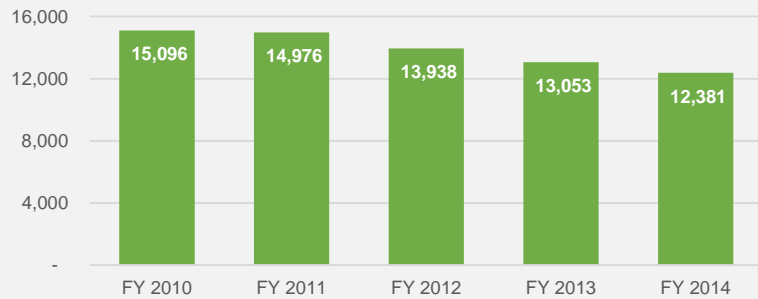


WHAT IS FYE?

- Stands for full-year equivalent
- Differs from student headcount
- Enrollment measure for budgeting purposes

What's happening with FYE at SCSU?

FYE Enrollment Over The Past 5 Years



Our current forecast for FY 2015

How is FYE calculated?

$$FYE = \frac{\sum \text{Undergraduate Credits}}{30} + \frac{\sum \text{Graduate Credits}}{20}$$

FYE enrollment uses registered credits for St. Cloud State courses. FYE for undergraduate courses is the sum of undergraduate credits divided by 30. FYE for graduate courses is the sum of graduate credits divided by 20. We typically report FYE by fiscal year, which includes summer, fall, and spring.

Not all students attempt the same amount of credits. Undergraduate students average 22 credits per year and represent the bulk of our FYE. Graduate students average 12 credits per year and are our second largest FYE producers. Senior-to-Sophomore students, while larger in headcount than graduate students, average 5 credits per year and are the smallest FYE.

All Students Are Not The Same
