

Where do our students come from? (Minnesota edition)

Students from Minnesota

This year, students from all 87 Minnesota counties were enrolled at SCSU, with Stearns county sending the most and Mahnomen and Kittson counties each sending only one (counting both graduate and undergraduate students).

Over the last three years,

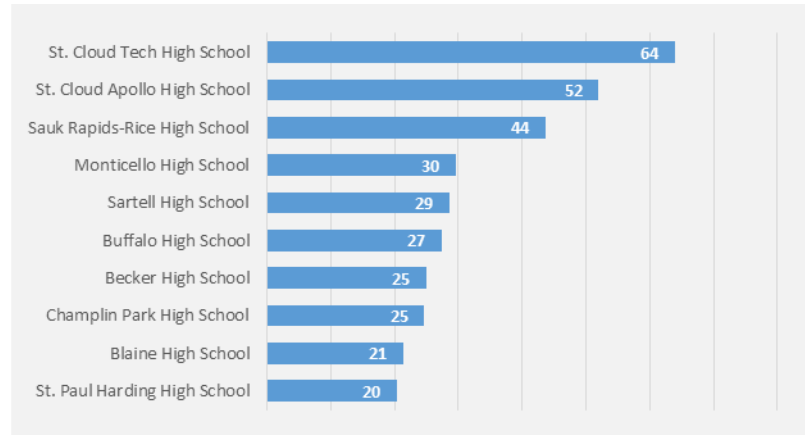
- 42% of first-time students come from the SCSU region (see region description below).
- 19% of first-time students come from the top 10 high schools (to the right).
- 54% of transfer-in students come from the top 10 “sending” institutions.

About 85% of the students enrolled at St. Cloud State are Minnesota residents.

(First-time students, 56% of new students, used to be called NEFs; transfer-in students used to be called NETs.)

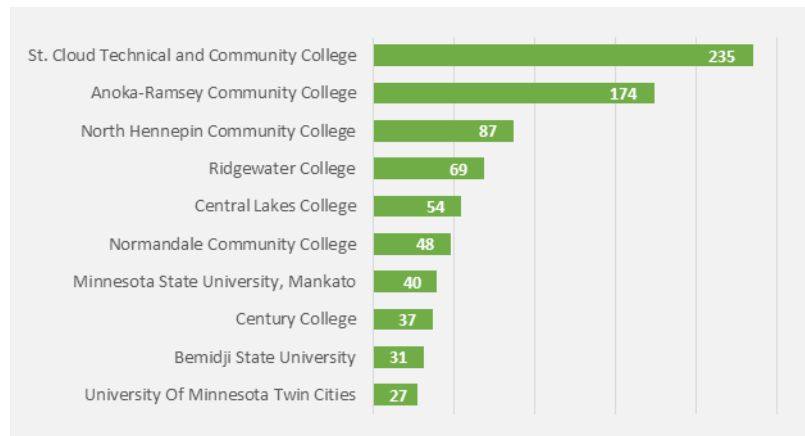
High schools sending the most students to SCSU

Do students from different regions perform the same?

Regions are defined by the university closest to a student’s home address.

From fall 2009 to fall 2013, first-time students from the Moorhead area have been outperforming students from other regions of the state in several 1st-year metrics.
