Students must participate in priority registration and advising day each semester if they expect to take any art courses the following semester. Students who are undecided or not officially admitted to an art major when they are eligible may take art courses only a space-available basis after priority registration is completed.

\* Students take Portfolio Review Benchmark after completing foundations courses (ART 101-105) with a 2.5 grade point average.

Please Note: Students could potentially start their Graphic Design rotation courses with ART 220 & 221 (only offered in Fall terms) in Fall of their 2nd Year vs their 3rd year if they have completed all the 100 level foundation courses by then.
