The BS Art Education major gives students the training to be art teachers and leads to a PreK-12 teacher licensure as approved by the Minnesota Board of Teaching.

While the SCSU programs meet the relevant academic requirements set by the licensure or certification board/agency in Minnesota, they may or may not meet the educational requirements for a licensure or certification in another state.
