Recommended route; actual order of courses may vary. Because of foundations requirements and prerequisites, students should begin working on an art major during their first semester if they wish to graduate in four years.

Students must participate in priority registration and advising day each semester if they expect to take any art courses the following semester. Students should meet with their Art Department advisor and attend the departmental advising day to make sure they are informed of the classes they need to take to graduate.

* Students take Portfolio Review Benchmark after completing foundations courses (ART 101-105) with a 2.5 grade point average.

Please Note:
Students could potentially start their Graphic Design rotation courses with ART 220 & 221 (only offered in Fall terms) in Fall of their 2nd Year vs their 3rd year if they have completed all the 100 level foundation courses by then.
