The Husky Food Pantry hosted a grand re-opening and ribbon-cutting ceremony on Nov. 28 in the main lounge of Case-Hill Hall to celebrate and showcase new additions and remodels made to the pantry. The pantry has partnered with Hope for the Community and its President and CEO Dr. Alan Goracke, an alumnus of SCSU.



The Husky Food Pantry now has two refrigerators and two freezers provided to allow for fresh and frozen food items to be offered to students for the first time. Since the beginning of October, the Huskies Food Pantry has distributed an average of 2,200 pounds of food to 140 St. Cloud State students per week.

Social Work master's student and Intern at the Pantry, Smriti Shrestha shared how important this resource is to all students. Many of CHWP students have had an opportunity to work, volunteer and intern here and were instrumental in its' success!



- Incorporates real life scenarios, learning objectives, professional development activities, savvy professional tips, pitfalls to avoid, and discussion questions


