Notes:

- The following **Social Work Core** courses must be taken at SCSU: SW 195, SW 216, HURL 201, and HURL 206. There are no equivalent courses offered at Saint Paul College. These classes are typically offered during the summer at SCSU.
 - Because of this, students should plan to transfer after completing the MnTC to keep on track to graduate within four years.
- Students are eligible to apply to the Social Work major when they have completed the following courses: SW 195, SOC 160, CEEP 262 or PSY 240, BIOL 103, HURL 201, HURL 206, and STAT 193.
- There is a formal application process to be admitted into the major. Students apply to the major when enrolled in SW 330, SW 340, and SW 345.
- The Social Work major requirements are organized sequentially into 4 total semesters (2 years) and <u>cannot</u> be taken in conjunction with any of the core classes listed above.
- Students must complete all SCSU requirements to be eligible to graduate, including a minimum of 120 earned credits, 40 credits at the 300 or 400 level, and 30 credits in residence.
