## Transfer Guide – BS Elementary Education

### Transfer Process

All transfer students seeking a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education should follow the admission procedures located at [www.stcloudstate.edu/transfer](http://www.stcloudstate.edu/transfer) to be admitted to St. Cloud State University (SCSU).

### About the Major:

The Elementary Education Major at SCSU prepares students for Minnesota teacher licensure in grades K-6. To complete the program, students must:

1. Fulfill the 10 goal areas of the [Liberal Education Program/Minnesota Transfer Curriculum](#).
  - **Licensure-Required Courses in the Liberal Education Program:** SPED 203: (Goal 5), MATH 201: (Goal 4), CPSY 262: (Goal 5)
  - **Recommended Courses in the Liberal Education Program:** ENGL 191: (Goal 1), CMST 192: (Goal 1)
2. Complete related content courses. These courses are designed to provide background knowledge in the content areas taught in elementary schools and to provide some suggested teaching methodologies.
  - ED 200, PESS 398, MATH 301, SST 320, CPSY 361, HURL 497, HURL 498, SCI 226, SCI 227
3. Complete education blocks. These are the major courses, consisting of four blocks of pre-determined, consecutive courses taken during the last four semesters of the program which include field experiences and student teaching.

### Requirements for Admission to the Elementary Education Major:

- Completion of ED 200 with grade of "C" (not "C-") or higher.
- Overall GPA of 2.75 or higher.
- Grade of "C" (not "C-") or higher in all completed courses required for the major.
- Completion of at least 12 credits at SCSU.
