# Step by Step Guide to Complete ICS/NIMS Courses through the FEMA Website

Step One is to go onto the St. Cloud State Emergency Prepardness Website at <u>http://</u><u>www.stcloudstate.edu/emergency/default.aspx</u> and it will bring you to this page:



Step Two is to click on the training link on the left side in the navigation box like the arrow indicates below



Step Three is to click on one of the three training courses on the bottom of the page that will directly link you to the FEMA training website as indicated below



Step Four is to enter the training by clicking on the Interactive Web Based Course link as indicated

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Once you complete the course in order to receive your certificate you must take the Final Online Exam which is located on the beginning FEMA page where you clicked on the Interactive Web Based Course. FE-MA now requires everyone to have a FEMA SID number in order to take exams. To register for a FEMA SID number you can click on the register for one here button as indicated below

#### What is a FEMA SID?

FEMA Student Identification (SID) number is a unique number generated and assigned to anyone who needs or is required to take training provided by a FEMA organization. Your FEMA SID uniquely identifies you throughout the FEMA organization and all of its agencies. The goal is for your FEMA SID to serve as your personal identification number instead of your Social Security Number (SSN) in support of FEMA's effort to decrease/cease the use of SSN for identifying and tracking individuals. After submitting your exam you will receive a certificate if you achieved a passing score. You will receive this certificate or a notice telling you that you did not pass. If you did not pass, you are allowed to take the exam as many times as needed to pass.

As of April 1, 2015, the Emergency Management Institute (EMI) no longer accepts Social Security Numbers (SSN) for exam submission.
