Last Fall I wrote about how we only had one day of fall weather – hmm this semester is confusing fall, summer what is it? I am back from sabbatical and am enjoying being back in the classroom.

This semester Dana Lodermeir, Missy Reichl and I will be presenting a poster related to chemical addictions and mental health issues in older adults. The poster will be presented at The Gerontological Society of America's annual conference in November. The data comes from a previous grant that Senior Helping Hands (St. Cloud Hospital) had from the Minnesota State Department of Human Services. The data for the poster will include 5 years with this grant program. Over this period more than four hundred clients were interviewed. I have also been working with Fountain Center, in Albert Lea, on this topic since 2005. The current grant with Fountain Center relates to special populations that might not be seen in the general treatment population. We are examining treatment protocols that might be more relevant to race, ethnicity, gender and age. This has the potential for making significant strides in assessment, treatment delivery, education and follow-up support services.

This semester I presented at the 11th Annual Gerontology Conference in St. Cloud on co-occurring disorders in older adults. The audience consisted of Nurses, Social Workers and other service professionals. We also had a booth to provide information on the Gerontology Program and of course sell t-shirts.

This spring check out our new topics course GERO 440/540 Ethics in Gerontology which will be taught Tuesdays/Thursdays 3:30-4:45. We are also in the process of updating our curriculum and will be proposing to add a course in Global Aging and make the Elder Law (also taught this spring) into a regular course.

The Gerontology Educator's Network (GEN) met at SCSU and we discussed how we can make gerontology education more vibrant and raise awareness of its importance. Information will be coming soon about amazing student opportunities.

This semester GERO 411/511 is gathering information on gubernatorial and house of representative candidates for the 6th congressional district. They are working in groups developing non-partisan packets of information on issues relevant to older adults and the larger community.
