Catch up with Ryan Fitzgerald and his new wife Casey!

MY NAME IS RYAN FITZGERALD I AM 43 MONTHS SOBER. WITH MY 30TH BIRTHDAY AROUND THE CORNER I NEVER IMAGINED I WOULD BE WHERE I AM AT TODAY.

My life has taken many wrong turns and I can honestly say I have no regrets because I am who I am from it. I started using and drinking at 11 and for the most part I maintained a decent and successful life until the age of 17. I was a great hockey player and baseball player, while maintaining a 3.0 G.P.A. in high school.

I used only marijuana and alcohol until age 17 when my life would take a tragic turn. I used cocaine for the first time and the future I had planned was ruined. I quickly escalated into becoming a daily user causing me to drop out of high school. I went on to use every drug possible and a few times when I was strung out I robbed gas stations. I was convicted with two felonies at age 20.

I slowly made my way to St. Cloud State in 2012 and while I wasn't using drugs I was drinking every day. I was a functioning alcoholic during the day and a belligerent drunk at night. After many probation violations I was finally given my very last chance and that's when I knew the Recovery Community was what I needed and wanted.

The Recovery Community gave me the guidance, support and accountability to pursue my education and further my life skills. The one thing that stands out to me being a part of the Recovery Community was the camaraderie--everyone wanted the next person to succeed just as much as the next. There were no favorites and if we had a problem we would talk it out in the process meetings.

I owe many thanks to the RC and the members who run the program, and the way I will pay back is to continue to lead by example. Being the first graduate of the Recovery Community is a tremendous honor. Graduating with a degree in Mass Communications- News Print was a huge step forward in my life.

While in the Recovery Community I met my wife, Casey, and I made many life-long friendships. My wife was the greatest gift I've ever received and I owe the Recovery Community for giving me the opportunity. Casey no longer drinks alcohol. She is 15 months' alcohol free. Casey saw that I didn't need alcohol to have a good time so she decided to quit drinking. It's amazing the impact one can have on another by just living the life they were intended to.

Thanks to a grant from the Otto Bremer Foundation, The Retreat has made \$250,000 in scholarship funds available to help applicants access any of The Retreat's programs.

We were particularly impressed with their Family Program that gives families and friends of those struggling with substance abuse the tools to effectively support their loved one in the face of the confusion and chaos of addiction. You do not have to have a loved one connected to The Retreat to attend. The Family Program is open to anyone and scholarships are available.
