## Our Husky Compact Dimension of the Year Reflection

The strength of the assertions, validity of facts provided, and writing quality of the argument will all factor into the score.

### Question Prompt:

There are seven student learning outcomes (SLOs) in the ACT dimension, shown below:

- A1: Cultivate self-awareness and personal and civic identity
- A2: Nurture communities that enhance the well-being of self, others, and the environment
- A3: Work to make a difference in the civic life of our communities
- A4: Exercise informed and responsible action to address ethical, societal and environmental challenges
- A5: Develop as a leader and collaborator
- A6: Empower self and others through service, leadership, and participation in change
- A7: Continue to learn, grow and strive for healthy balance in an ever-changing world

Choose the **THREE** outcomes that you feel are best accomplished through your project. For each of these three, provide specific examples of how you have met the learning objectives. Your argument for each objective should be specific, citing the work you are presenting and supporting your claim; as much as possible, indicate *how* you met the objective, rather than simply stating that you did.

### Evaluation Rubric

For each of the three objectives in the ACT dimension chosen by the student, a score will be chosen on how well the student has documented their accomplishment of the learning objective based on the following:

- 0: No argument is made for the objective at all
- 1: An argument is made that the objective is met, but there are few, if any, specifics provided; it is simply an assertion with little justification.
- 2: The argument is made, and one example of how the objective was met is provided, with one fact or reference to the project.
- 3: The argument is reasonably crafted, providing either one example of how the objective was met with multiple facts or references to the project... OR... two examples of how the objective was met are provided, each with at least one fact or reference to the project.
- 4: The argument is well-crafted, providing more than two examples of how the objective was met. All assertions are supported with facts and reference to the project.
