Al Companion & Whiteboard Now Available in MinnState Zoom Service



There are new features available in the MinnState Zoom service, including Al Companion and Whiteboard.

- The AI Companion can assist with meeting recording and summarizing. The AI Companion is turned off by default, but can be turned on in "Settings" within the MinnState Zoom service.
- You can access your Zoom Whiteboards on your Zoom dashboard and/or include them in a meeting within the meeting's settings. The virtual Whiteboard offers several templates to assist with organization, collaboration, research and more.

Inviting HIPAA Zoom Account Holders to Zoom Meetings/Webinars



Some employees are required to use a HIPAA-compliant instance of Zoom, which may cause them to be unable to join Zoom meetings/webinars that require StarID authentication to join. To allow access, when setting up a meeting/webinar in Zoom, you can modify the authentication rules in the security settings by changing it to "Minnesota State Colleges and Universities." This will pull up all MinnState institutions, which you can edit as applicable.

Technology Updates in Wick Science Building 125



A new polycom conferencing system recently replaced the previous audio visual system in Wick Science Building 125. The room is now controlled through the polycom touchscreen and the projectors are controlled through the handheld remote, both available on the instructor station.

Instructors should bring their own device to use technology in the room as there is no longer an in-room computer. Instructors can use the HDMI connection on the desk to connect directly to the polycom system, and can also connect their laptop through the USB document camera to share materials to the room through a Zoom meeting.

To help reduce bouncing sounds within the space, acoustic tiles were installed in the back of the room.
