ST. CLOUD, Minn., May -- St. Cloud State College's eight academic divisions will be reorganized into three schools under an administrative plan approved Monday (May 14) by the State College Board.

The new organization, which goes into effect next fall, provides for a School of Education, a School of Science, Literature and Arts and a School of Business and Industry. Each school will have a dean, who will be responsible to a dean of academic administration.

Establishing three schools will allow more flexibility as the college's enrollment and curriculum expands rapidly in the next few years, President George F. Budd
told the board. The divisions to be replaced are Arts and Music, Business, Education, Health and Physical Education, Languages and Literature, Mathematics and
Science, Psychology and Social Sciences.

Departments in the School of Education will be elementary education, physical education and health, psychology, secondary education and special education. Student teaching and the Campus Laboratory School will provide auxiliary services.

Fifteen departments will make up the School of Science, Literature and Arts.

They are art, biology, chemistry, economics, English, foreign languages, geography, history, mathematics, music, philosophy, physics, political science, speech-theatre and sociology.

The School of Business and Industry will be composed of three departments: business administration, business education and industrial arts.

Offices and services which will be coordinated by a dean of students are freshman and foreign student advisement, financial aids, health service, housing, placement, student activities, testing and counseling and veterans' services.

Five bureaus will be responsible directly to the president. They are physical resources, information services, instructional resources, research and special services. Graduate studies and the registrar's office will maintain liaison with the academic dean.

Dr. Charles Balcer is academic dean and Dr. Robert Zumwinkle is dean of students. Deans for the three schools and departmental chairmen have not yet been appointed.
