

## Why don't we object?

### February 4, 2009: ARIZONA

 This afternoon in Maricopa County, AZ, more than 200 Latino immigrants were chained, dressed in prison stripes and forced to march down a public street from a county jail to a detainment camp in a desert industrial zone outside Phoenix.

They were filmed by television news crews and guarded by at least 50 Maricopa County Sheriff's deputies, ...armed with shotguns and automatic rifles. At least two canine units were present; a Sheriff's helicopter hovered overhead.





## 1938: Nazis' Austrian Prisoners at Dachau





In March 2003, after the Iraqi government paraded five captured U.S. soldiers in front of television cameras, then, U.S. Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld <u>protested</u> that it was a violation of the Geneva Convention.






