Bachelor of Science – Community Health

Transfer Process

All transfer students seeking a Bachelor of Science degree in Community Health should follow the admission procedures located on the following website in order to be admitted to St. Cloud State University: <u>www.stcloudstate.edu/transfer</u>. A student must first be accepted to St. Cloud State and then may apply to the Community Health major after meeting the major's admission requirements.

Program Information:

- HLTH 210, HLTH 215, HLTH 225, and HLTH 325 are the introductory courses in the Community Health major. All students must complete these courses, and PESS 249 or BIOL 202, to continue into higher level major courses.
- *Students are required to take an anatomy course, equivalent to SCSU's PESS 249 or BIOL 202, as a major requirement.
- **Students are required to take a statistics course, equivalent to SCSU's STAT 219 or SOC 304, as a major requirement.
- Connect with a Community Health advisor before registering for your first semester of classes to discuss transfer classes and course sequencing at St. Cloud State University.

- Students are required to complete the 10 goal areas in the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC), known as the Liberal Education Program at SCSU.
- Students must complete a minimum of 40 upper-division credits (300-400 level coursework) to graduate from SCSU.
- If a student completes a goal within the MnTC, the same goal will be completed at SCSU once transferred.
