Additional Notes (to complete the program in 4 semesters):

- By the end of the 1st semester at SCSU, transfer students must have completed: CPSY 101, CPSY 102, CEEP 262/PSY 240, and PSY 115. If these requirements are not completed, additional time may be added to academic degree plan.
- Separate Internship Application & Eligibility Requirements Exist. Consult with your advisor.
- Students must complete all SCSU requirements, including a minimum of 120 earned credits, 40 credits at the 300 or 400 level, and 30 credits in residence.
 - ****Transfer students are encourage to take major electives and minor electives at the 300 or 400 level (whenever possible). Students must complete at least 40 credits at the 300-400 level to graduate from SCSU.**
