Transfer Process

All transfer students seeking a Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice should follow the admission procedures located on the following website in order to be admitted to St. Cloud State University (SCSU): www.stcloudstate.edu/transfer. More information can be found in the [University Catalog](#).

The following SCTCC courses transfer to SCSU’s Criminal Justice Program:

*MATH 1350 OR MATH 1351 Introduction to Statistics (Goal 4)	STAT 103 Statistical Thinking
**PHIL 1320 Ethics (Goal 6 & 9)	PHIL 212 Moral Problems and Theories
**ENGL 1340 Intro to Multicultural Literature (Goal 6 & 7)	ENGL 216 African American Literature (Diversity/RIGR)

* Serves as the prerequisite for STAT 219 Statistical Methods I for Social Sciences at SCSU, which is required for the major.
** SCSU Criminal Justice approved elective course.

The following courses are *suggested* for particular MnTC Goals:

The following courses are *suggested* for students considering law enforcement licensure:

SCTCC Course	SCSU Course
***EMSC 1462 First Responder	TECH Transfer

*** Course is a requirement of the SKILLS program. Course transfers as TECH transfer credits.

It is recommended that students take these courses as part of the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC).

If a student completes a Goal area within the MnTC, the same Goal area will be complete at SCSU once transferred.

Additional Requirements to Consider when Degree Planning:

- Completion of 10 Goals (40 credits) in the MnTC (known as the Liberal Education Program at SCSU)
- 40 upper-division credits (300-400 level coursework) are required to graduate from SCSU
- Completion of three Diversity classes. (Maybe adjusted depending on the amount of transfer credits). One diversity course must be an approved Racial Issues Graduate Requirement (RIGR) course (see Goal 7 for RIGR courses)
- Complete Residency Requirement. 30 credits must be earned at SCSU
- Earn a minimum of 120 credits to graduate with a bachelor’s degree
- Must maintain a major GPA of least 2.5 after being admitted
- Additional major course requirements to be taken at SCSU
