

A Commitment to Student Success, Civic Engagement and Real-World Problem Solving


St. Cloud State University's School of Public Affairs is recognized far and wide for its **innovative approaches to educating students and positively impacting society**.

We are proud to be Minnesota's only school of public affairs that focuses on undergraduate as well as graduate students. We combine instruction, research and community outreach to prepare students to become leaders.

You may know us for the research and analysis provided by the School of Public Affairs Research Institute, through our public opinion polling from our SCSU Survey Center or from our economic analysis in the *St. Cloud Area Quarterly Business Report*. Perhaps you have attended our Winter Institute, an annual celebration of economic education.

But these achievements only begin to describe who and what we are. Incorporating research-based interpretation of public policy and management of the public interest, the School of Public Affairs contains four distinct departments — Criminal Justice, Economics, Geography and Planning, and Political Science.

All share a commitment to student success, civic engagement and real-world problem solving.



Criminal Justice



The Criminal Justice degree programs develop students' foundational knowledge and skills by producing graduates who are ready for meaningful careers in the 21st Century criminal justice system. Their classroom knowledge is enhanced through practical field experiences. Curriculum equips students to be producers and consumers of research and knowledge. Students are taught about new technologies and policies that can be used to build trust and legitimacy within their communities through ethical public service.

Geography and Planning



Our Geography and Planning department is one of Minnesota's most comprehensive. Students can specialize in geographic information science (GIS), hospitality and tourism, land surveying, planning and community development, social studies education or cultural/physical/regional geography. Much of the learning takes place outside the classroom. Opportunities range from using drone-mounted cameras to map rough terrain to addressing challenging community issues such as suburban sprawl, aging neighborhoods, heritage preservation, redevelopment and traffic congestion.

Economics



Economics students study changes in the global economy over the last 40 years and their impact on the economic future. Students are trained in practical problem-solving techniques that work across public and private sectors, helping them develop analytical skills to understand private, nonprofit and government influences on the economy. Active student organizations and internships offer opportunities to build leadership skills and connect with professionals and alumni at businesses and government agencies around the world.

Political Science



Political science students learn the theories and practices of government and politics locally, nationally and internationally. They learn about the institutions of government and the practices of political discourse and interactions, which prepare them for a variety of careers in government and nonprofit organizations. To meet this end, the department offers undergraduate major and minor programs in Political Science and International Relations and our signature graduate program, Master of Public Administration.

The School of Public Affairs, formed in 2011, adopted its first strategic plan in 2014. As the school's purpose and emphasis became clearer by our work with students and in our communities, we refreshed our strategic plan by consolidating and focusing earlier strategies on six goals, adopted in 2018.

- 6 Create and develop an innovative, interdisciplinary and creative collaborative learning space.
