SELECTIVE SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

For <u>male</u> students between the ages of 18-25, you must provide verification that you have registered with the Selective Services. To verify registration for Selective Service you may do one of the following:

- Pick up a Selective Service mail-back form at the nearest U.S. Post Office and submit it to the address shown on the card. The Selective Services Office sends a confirmation of registration within 30 to 90 days. You must attach a copy of the confirmation to the <u>MN Prosperity Act Certification</u>.
- 2. Pick up a Selective Service mail-back form at the nearest U.S. Post Office, complete the information, and attach it to the <u>MN Prosperity Act Certification</u>. The Office of Records and Registration will mail the original form to the Selective Service office on your behalf. This will allow your request for resident tuition to be processed without waiting for the 30 to 90 days response time from the Selective Service office.

Note: In accordance with federal law, **female** students are not required to register with Selective Service.
