# From the Desk of the Vice President

With months of careful preparation, the Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS) department is moving to a payfor-service model for individual counseling on June 1, 2021. The focus of this operational shift is achieving financial stability for the unit while delivering quality, individualized support for students as outlined by the It's Time strategy for St. Cloud State. Further, it aligns with the integration of the CAPS, Collegiate Recovery, Health Promotion, Medical Clinic and UChoose to enhance individualized student support through the establishment of a shared mission, values and practices across all of the departments.

This spring, students receiving CAPS services were contacted directly and provided information about the new process and requirements for continued service. The students were also invited to meet with Mid-Minnesota Legal Aid insurance representatives at a SCSU event to gain health insurance coverage for themselves. Moving forward, each student requesting services from CAPS will receive individualized guidance for using existing healthcare insurance or securing a new plan for themselves and their wellbeing.

I would like to share with you some talking points developed by a working group on integrated student care, which I have convened regularly since May 2020. As you discuss CAPS offerings and access for students, please consider sharing the following details:

## Access:

- CAPS will offer an initial, free mental health consultation with every student who is seeking mental health care for the first time.
- For students without healthcare insurance, university personnel will be working with students individually and on a case-by-case basis to connect students to our community partners, such as Mid-Minnesota Legal Aid, to identify healthcare insurance providers.
- Gaining access to health insurance and knowledge on how it works is an essential life skill that will foster independence and equip students to care for themselves and others after graduation.

## Sustainability:

- This shift to a pay-for-service model will help foster financial sustainability for the university as we continue supporting students' mental health in a way that promotes their academic and personal success.
- The new model can enable SCSU to maintain the mental health care services it offers to students using licensed professionals.
- The new model may also fund future increases in staffing levels to meet increased student demand.

## Integration:

- St. Cloud State University moves to a pay-for-service model for Counseling & Psychological Services (CAPS) as it implements an integrated health care model for students.
- Billing insurance is the methodology selected to promote equity, access and consistency.
- The integrated health model brings together both primary care and mental health care for students.
- This approach aligns with industry and community practices and models of care.

An Executive Director for Integrated Student Care will report to the Vice President for Student Life. They will engage with Medical Director, Dr. Brent Nielsen; Counseling Director, Dr. Jennifer Dorholt; Wellness and Health Promotion

Director, Ms. Jennifer Johnson; and Associate Director for Administration, Ms. Kimberly Ohmann, to build upon the positive work being done in each area in order to provide excellent, integrated care to SCSU students.

Student housing is available this summer as an option for students between lease agreements or arriving into St. Cloud before fall semester.


- The Department of Residential Life offers housing contracts to best fit a student's summer class schedule.
