Hearings

Open Gallery I –

- **Lee LaDue (Gender Violence Prevention Coordinator – Women's Center)** – client numbers continue to be high. Not all of these are current victims though. Reaching a little over 6,000 students. Training on the last Saturday of this month. That will last 6 hours. Looking for people to do this training. This year so far has been really different but positive. Reports are down quite a bit so far. Hoping that this is due to reduced violence and not a reduce in people actually reporting incidents. CH14 Hearing in Minnesota. Due Process for this is very similar to civil cases. Many new sexual misconduct interim measures...learn more about this at www.ccasa.org. If you want to get involved and have a say in these interims you can talk with the chancellor's office, write letters to your state legislators, or pass statements and policies through Students United.
- **Mitch Karstens (Director of Atwood)** – Looking to request \$25,000 (from mini grants) to create a large scale program/event on campus. A band, a concert, or a speaker. Atwood, DCI, and Admissions working together so far. Asking Student Government if we will help on this also. Once they receive the money they want our help to organize the event. Wanting collaboration across campus. Unsure of whether students will be required to pay for the event... This depends on what the event will be in the end. If there is a charge at all it would be at the very most \$10-15. The last time that this was done was 2008 with the rap artist Neo. Continuous feedback on wanting a large scale event through donuts and dialogue and surveys. The application for this event is due next week and the actual event would be held in the spring, before the end of the semester. If all of the \$25,000 is not used the funds would then go back/stay in the accounts in which they were originated. I encourage all of you to participate in the Atwood planning team. On October 30th-Nov 5th there will be 34 Super Bowl rings in Atwood. We are the only stop in central Minnesota that will have these. Atwood 50th Anniversary starting November 4th. Invited many past employees and alumni. Scholarship campaign for student leaders.
