- Jen Furan and Jen Matzke (Res Life and Public Safety)
 - o Started safety walks in the south side, survey.
 - o Wanted to know student perceptions of safety in the south side neighborhood.
 - o Survey data showed that they felt safe walking in the southside during the daylight
 - o Survey data showed that the perception of safety decreases during the night-time, but the majority still felt safe.
 - o Students liked living in the south side neighborhood because it is close to campus.
 - o Illegal parking, and litter/garbage is the biggest issues for students living in the south side.
 - o Many students were not aware of the renting 101 website.
 - Student Government members are able to download the Public Safety App early before it goes live in the spring semester.
 - o Friend walk is a new feature where you can ping a friend and they can see where you are in the app.

 - The blue button on the app will only contact public safety and will only work on campus.
 - There is an emergency contact button that can call 911 for you.
 - There is no delay in calling Public safety with the button so accidental presses will still go to public safety.
 - The app will require a data plan if there is no WiFi
 - Public Safety is not able to get escort requests from the app at this time.
