 - Launched August 9th for staff for advising platform
 - Progress of the EAB
 - o %2 retention students -% 3.6 achieved fall 2017 88.6% now
 - 226 staff have completed training
 - 27 academic programs
 - Have exceeded targets across the board
 - The largest areas, Advising Transitions, Honors, Business program
 - o 10406 reports so far
 - EAB started 9 months ago and progress at 6 months others have done in two years
 - o Going next year- Advising Appointment Campaigns- to make an appoint by clicking on a link
 - Wrapping up academic advising report to notify those students are struggling that may affect student's ability to continue on with academics 6 members on the pilot and have affected 65 students
 - Working on a sophomore retention plan
