KEYNOTE SPEAKER / Ron Ferguson, PhD

Title: Lead to Belong: Achieving Inclusive Community via Intentional Leadership

In this keynote, Dr. Ronald Ferguson encourages attendees to take intentional approaches, as leaders in our respective circles, to empower those around us even amidst a milieu of disempowerment. Via a mixture of conversation and group activity, participants will explore the crossroads of belonging and opportunities for inclusive leadership. Ultimately, faculty and staff will gain understanding in the crucial role of leadership (titled or not) in creating belonging. This includes including leading *with* our students to create sustainable progress toward a culture of belonging on campus.



Ferguson Bio: Dr. Ronald Ferguson teaches sociology at Ridgewater College, where he offers courses in racial/ethnic studies and social problems. In addition to teaching, he served as one of Minnesota State's Equity and Inclusion Coordinators. Dr. Ferguson has published papers in: Great Plains Sociologist, Sociological Imagination, and Educational Research: Theory and Practice. A selection of works includes the evaluation of the college experience by Native American first year students as well as exploring the parenting process in biracial identity development. He also co-authored the book: "What' up with the Brothers? Black Masculinity in the 21st Century." Dr. Ferguson has a long history of pursuing positive educational change throughout Minnesota as well as ongoing participation with The Minnesota Group Consulting. In addition, he actively serves professional associations, including a previous position as president of the Sociologists of Minnesota. He currently resides in central Minnesota engaging in local efforts related to positive, systemic change.
