

## Medium Designations for MLA Works Cited Source Entries

The 2009 MLA Guidelines require that, in a works cited page, the source medium be inserted at the end of a source entry in most cases. The source medium (e.g., print or web) is followed by a period. Below is an example of a source entry with the medium, *Print*, listed at the end.
