Outlook Not Showing Pictures in Emails



To help protect you and your computer, Microsoft Outlook blocks automatic picture downloads from the internet by default. This may cause you to receive emails that do not automatically show the picture, even from senders you trust. To see these pictures, choose the InfoBar at the top of the message and then click "Download Pictures."
